Passage 2

Matthew 25:31-40

Reflection Read Matthew 25:31-40

What is the "kingdom of God"? What is the purpose of letting God's light shine in us?

By what criteria will God divide the sheep and the goats?

What criteria did Jesus say the world would be able to determine if we're one of his followers?

Passage 3 Romans 12:1-2

Reflection

Read Romans 12:1-2

What does Romans 12:1-2 call us to do? But the call from Romans 12:1-2 is for followers of Christ not to blend in but to stand out and to have the same self-giving attitude that Jesus had.

So, how do we get back to Christ's call on our lives to be a people that serve others rather than just ourselves?

Passage 4

Acts 4:33-35

Reflection If you read through the history of the early church you'll quickly discover that the church took these teachings to heart and made it a key part of their teaching and practices and in their witness to the world.

> How did the early Christians view their money and the use of it? Read Acts 4:33-35
