Passage 1 2 Peter 1:20-21 (NIV)

Did people write The Bible about God or Did God write The Bible through people?

“Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet’s own interpretation of things. 21 For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.”

Reflection God is the author and people are the writers.

Passage 2 2 Timothy 3:14-17 | Deuteronomy 29:29 (NIV)

“But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, 15 and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. 16 All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, 17 so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.”

“The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but the things revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may follow all the words of this law.”

Reflection Why is it so important to read the Bible everyday?

Passage 3 Psalm 40:6-8 (NIV)

“6 Sacrifice and offering you did not desire— but my ears you have opened[a]—burnt offerings and sin offerings[b] you did not require. 7 Then I said, ‘Here I am, I have come—it is written about me in the scroll.[c] 8 I desire to do your will, my God; your law is within my heart.’”

Reflection Who do you think David was speaking of?

Passage 4 Hebrews 10:5-10

5 Therefore, when Christ came into the world,(A) he said: "Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me;(B) 6 with burnt offerings and sin offerings you were not pleased. 7 Then I said, 'Here I am—it is written about me in the scroll(C)— I have come to do your will, my God.'"(D)

"8 First he said, 'Sacrifices and offerings, burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not desire, nor were you pleased with them'(E)—though they were offered in accordance with the law. 9 Then he said, 'Here I am, I have come to do your will.'(F) He sets aside the first to establish the second. 10 And by that will, we have been made holy(G) through the sacrifice of the body(H) of Jesus Christ once for all."

Reflection Who was this writer speaking about?

Why do you think that the Old Testament points us to Jesus and Jesus points us back to the Old Testament?

Passage 5 John 5:39 (NIV) | Romans 16:25-27 (NIV)

You study the Scriptures diligently because you think that in them you have eternal life. These are the very Scriptures that testify about me yet you refuse to come to me to have life.

Can we truly know who Jesus is without reading and understanding God's word (Old Testament through NewTestament)?

"Now to him who is able to establish you in accordance with my gospel, the message I proclaim about Jesus Christ, in keeping with the revelation of the mystery hidden for long ages past, 26 but now revealed and made known through the prophetic writings by the command of the eternal God, so that all the Gentiles might come to the obedience that comes from faith— 27 to the only wise God be glory forever through Jesus Christ! Amen."

Reflection Paul says the Scriptures reveal the mystery of GOD—Jesus!

Application

Five reasons you can trust and believe that the Bible is true.

1. God's Word is Inspired—God Himself speaks by His Holy Spirit through Humans.
2. God's Word is Inerrant—God does not speak to tell lies or to deceive us
3. God's Word is Infallible—God can be trusted because He tells us the truth
4. God's Word is Authoritative—God speaks so that we can do His will
5. God's Word is Sufficient—God's words are all we need to truly know him.
