## Passage 1 1 Kings 18:16-21

**Reflection** How has trouble come to the prophet of Israel?

What is Obadiah's concern when Elijah asks to talk to Ahab?

What does Obadiah tell the king? What does Ahab do? What does he call Elijah?

Who is invited to Mount Carmel?

What choice does Elijah ask the people to make? How do they respond?

The people of Israel were worshipping both Baal and Yahweh. Why is this sort of thing not alright?

## Passage 2 1 Kings 18:22-29

**Reflection** What is Elijah's point in comparing himself with the number of Baal's prophets?

What test does Elijah suggest?

How do the prophets of Baal approach their God?

What must the Israelites think when Baal does not respond to the prophets?

In what ways do we sometimes make a choice between total devotion and only partial devotion to God?

How do people sacrifice themselves to chase after false idols of today?

Why do you think other "gods" still hold sway in your life?

**Passage 3** 1 Kings 18:30-39

**Reflection** How is the altar of the Lord Prepared

What do the twelve stones represent?

How does Elijah, the prophet of the Lord, approach his God?

What is the Lord's response? How do the people respond now?

**Passage 4** 1 Kings 18:40-46

**Reflection** What happens to the prophets of Baal?

How does this story relate to Jesus (Do we need to shed our blood for God to respond to us)?

How are we called to be modern day prophets?

**Application**

The same way Elijah called the people back to repentance is the same way we are called to live Holy lives for God and lead people to him. Pray for God to help you continue to change and look like Jesus to lead others back to the Father.
