## Tormentors From Hell Revelation 9:1–6

And the <u>fifth angel</u> blew his trumpet, and I saw a star <u>fallen</u> from heaven to earth, and he <u>was given</u> the key to the shaft of the bottomless pit. He opened the shaft of the bottomless pit, and from the shaft rose smoke like the smoke of a great furnace, and the sun and the air were darkened with the smoke from the shaft. Then from the smoke came <u>locusts</u> on the earth, and they were <u>given</u> power like the power of <u>scorpions</u> of the earth. They were told not to harm the grass of the earth or any green plant or any tree, but only those people who <u>do not have the seal of God</u> on their foreheads. They were <u>allowed</u> to <u>torment</u> them for <u>five months</u>, but not to kill them, and their <u>torment</u> was like the <u>torment</u> of a scorpion when it stings someone. And in those days people will seek death and will not find it. They will long to die, but death will flee from them.

## Did You Think They "Looked" like Locusts?

Revelation 9:7–12

In <u>appearance</u> the **locusts** were like **horses** prepared for battle: on their heads were what looked like crowns of gold; their faces were like **human faces**, their hair **women's hair**, and their teeth like **lions' teeth**; they had breastplates like breastplates of iron, and the noise of their wings was like the noise of many chariots with horses rushing into battle. They have tails and stings like scorpions, and their <u>power to hurt people for **five months**</u> is in their tails. They have as **king** over them the <u>angel of the bottomless pit</u>. His name in Hebrew is <u>Abaddon</u>, and in Greek he is called <u>Apollyon</u>.

The **first woe** has passed; behold, **two woes** are still to come.

"Truly, I say to you, <u>this</u> generation will not pass away until <u>all</u> these things take place.

Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

But concerning that <u>day</u> and <u>hour</u> <u>no one knows</u>, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man.

For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the

## War From the Euphrates

Then the <u>sixth angel</u> blew his trumpet, and I heard a voice from the four horns of the golden altar before God, saying to the sixth angel who had the trumpet, "Release the four angels who are bound at the great river Euphrates." So the four angels, who had been prepared for the hour, the day, the month, and the year, were released to kill a third of mankind. The number of mounted troops was twice ten thousand times ten thousand; I heard their number. And this is how I saw the horses in my vision and those who rode them: they wore breastplates the color of fire and of sapphire and of sulfur, and the heads of the horses were like lions' heads, and fire and smoke and sulfur came out of their mouths. By these three plagues <u>a third of mankind was killed</u>, by the fire and smoke and sulfur coming out of their mouths. For the power of the horses is in their mouths and in their tails, for their tails are like <u>serpents with heads</u>, and by means of them they wound. The rest of mankind, who were not killed by these plagues, <u>did not repent</u> of the works of their hands nor give up worshiping demons and idols of gold and silver and bronze and stone and wood, which cannot see or hear or walk, nor did they repent of their murders or their sorceries or their sexual immorality or their thefts.
