

# **Forgiveness & Confession**

"forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors." ~Jesus (Matthew 6:12)

"For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins."

Ultimately it is good news that God takes forgiveness so seriously.

#### An Uncomfortable Balance

Exodus 34:6-7

And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, "The Lord, the <u>compassionate</u> and <u>gracious</u> God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and **forgiving** <u>wickedness</u>, <u>rebellion</u> and <u>sin</u>. <u>Yet</u> he does not leave the guilty **unpunished**..."

Forgiveness puts God's love and mercy at odds with His holiness and justice.

**Mystery Solved** 

Romans 3:23-26

for <u>all have sinned</u> and fall short of the glory of God, and <u>all are justified freely</u> by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of his blood—to be received by <u>faith</u>.

He did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished— he did it to demonstrate his righteousness at the present time, so as **to be just** and **the one who justifies** those who have <u>faith</u> in Jesus.

#### Living in Balance

1 John 1:7-10
