Matthew 14:22-36 [Mk.6:45-52; Jn.6:16-21] ~ Mt. 8:23-27 ~

²² Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd. ²³ After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone, ²⁴ and the boat was already a considerable distance from land, buffeted by the waves because the wind was against it.

Space to be Alone – for Encounter

Jesus sent them into something challenging

²⁵ Shortly before dawn Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake. ²⁶ When the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and cried out in fear. ²⁷ But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." ²⁸ "Lord, if it's you," Peter replied, "tell me to come to you on the water." ²⁹ "Come," he said. Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus.

Jesus goes up, but doesn't stay on the mountaintop, He is back down with the people

Tell me to Come – Come – He came

³⁰ But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, "Lord, save me!"

What is your wind? What makes you doubt the presence of Jesus?

³¹ Immediately, Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. "You of little faith," he said, "why did you doubt?" ³² And when they climbed into the boat, the wind died down. ³³ Then those who were in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

When they all come out, the disciples and we, as readers, must realize the people have no idea who they are dealing with. They just wanted healing. But when a man who walks on water reaches out his hand to grab you and pull you up from death — that's an entirely different kind of miracle and a Jesus we need to come to know and worship.
