# OUTLASTERS—1 READINESS OVER HAPPINESS

How joyful are those who fear the LORD and delight in obeying his commands. <sup>2</sup> <u>Their children will be successful everywhere</u>; <u>an entire generation of godly people will be blessed</u>. <sup>3</sup> They themselves will be wealthy, and <u>their good deeds will last forever</u>... <sup>4</sup> They are <u>generous</u>, <u>compassionate</u>, and <u>righteous</u>... <sup>6</sup> Those who are righteous <u>will be long</u> remembered. Psalm 112:1-4, 6 NLT

- First generation is marked by strong leadership, economic prosperity, intellectual progress and/or spiritual growth.
- Second generation inherits something they appreciate but didn't earn. There is often a loss of drive, creativity, and appetite for risk. The main goal often becomes preservation.
- Third generation has only seen preservation and entrenchment. They often lack vision, passion, and personal identity. It's common to reject the values of those who have gone before them.
