MINISTRY MOMENT

CHRISMON TREE | JILL GEYEN

Having the Chrismon tree up during Advent has always been a cherished church tradition for me. Among the decorations and activities, it stands as a symbol of what Christmas is about.

Christmas trees by themselves do not have a Christian origin. But they can serve as a reminder of the gift and meaning of Christ's birth, life, death, and resurrection. Trees bring life to other living things. The lights on the Chrismon tree remind us that Christ is the Light of the world. The ornaments in white. gold, silver as well as the pearls, remind us of Jesus' purity and majesty. They represent many aspects of Christ and what He is to us. The crown at the top reminds us that He is our King and Lord.

The other symbols on the tree help us to remember other important things about Jesus that are written in scripture. He is the alpha and the omega. He is part of the eternal trinity. He brings peace. He is the anchor and symbol of our faith brought forth through the virgin birth. The many different crosses remind us of His crucifixion, His wounds, and the power of the resurrection.

Our culture has oversaturated this season with commercialism, hectic schedules, and unrealistic expectations that often leave us exhausted, depressed and disappointed. There are many who celebrate Christmas only for the gift-giving and fun, leaving Jesus completely out of the picture. For those of us that believe that Jesus is, "the reason for the season", we can lean

into His promises of love and peace, remembering that His birth was a gracious gift to humankind. As I look at the Chrismon tree, I think about this gift. We are redeemed and loved by our Savior. That is the best gift of all!


Equipping
