The Service of Tenebrae follows a tradition of the church dating back to the seventh century. Grom Latin the word Tenebrae means "darkness" and commemorates the final hours of our Lord's life on earth, as he suffered death upon the cross. As the candles are extinguished, they symbolize the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus. The gradual darkening of the church portrays the diminishing light of the world as Christ was departing from it.

The Solemn Reproaches of the Cross have their origin in the Good Ariday liturgy and can be traced back to the seventh century.
