Dear Friends,

This morning the pastors, choir and orchestra are presenting Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 along with the music and text of the Brahms Requiem (in English) in a creative and contemplative communion service with a focus on *leaning into hope* in the midst of the messiness and brokenness that accompanies life. One of the ways we will emphasize leaning into hope will be with the use of a "kintsugi" bowl. Kintsugi is the Japanese form of restoration through gold bonding. In this tradition when a valued treasure is broken or cracked it is repaired with a gold bonding that makes it more beautiful, more valuable and more treasured than it was in its original state.

Kintsugi is a concept I personally have used to find peace and beauty in the midst of the loss, brokenness and storms I have faced. When God fuses our brokenness back together with His gentle touch of love we are made more valuable and more beautiful than we were even in our original form. We have greater depth; we have a more genuine compassion; we know Our Maker in a more intimate way; our eyes are opened to the colors and brilliance of creation and to the intricacies of our differences; we love more fully and with greater ease; we understand grace, and we can look upon and touch our scars and the scars of others, recognizing beauty in the ruggedness of those scars.

We invite you to write personal restoration needs on the Prayers of Restoration cards provided in the pew and place them in kintsugi bowls restored by UPPC artist, Nancy Keay. The requests on these prayer cards will be prayed over by UPPC staff, deacons and elders.

My prayer is that every person who enters our doors today may be covered in God's love and that all will experience a spiritual restoration. May it be so! In nomine Patris et Filii et Spiritus Sancti.
