We SHARE & MAKE ROOM...

In Flourishing, on the Discipleship Journey we learn how making room and sharing our time, talents and relational energy with others can lead to human flourishing. Represented in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, God's very nature is relational, and as human beings created in God's image, so are we. Yet, so much of the brokenness in the world stems from broken relationships and a failure to see our connection to one another.

Archbishop Desmond Tutu often used the African concept of Ubuntu to describe the relational nature of God and humanity – my existence is intertwined with your existence; my well-being is intertwined your well-being. Or as the Apostle Paul said in reference to the Church: If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. (1 Cor 12:26 NIV).

We flourish when our relationships with God, our neighbor, our community, and the world are healthy, just, and thriving, and we suffer when these relationships are broken at some level. God does not intend for each of us as individuals to solve all the world's problems. The beauty of being intertwined with each other is that individually we only need to worry about the small piece that God has set aside for us to do, while others focus on the pieces God has for them. But knowing where God wishes us to focus requires discernment and discernment is always best done in community.

Being of a part of *Flourishing* at UPPC can help you discern where God is inviting you in this season of your life to make room to focus your time, talents, and relational energy to help others flourish.

Maybe it is something new God is inviting you into, or maybe it is going deeper into areas where you are already serving, but regardless of what specific piece God has set aside for you, imagine what could happen if we all served as Christ's ambassadors helping each other become reconciled with God and one another. (2 Cor 5:18-20). What a beautiful place that will be!
