#### MAIN PASSAGE

Revelation 5:1-5

#### **SERMON THEMES**

The meaning of the scroll

Only One found Worthy

#### **CROSS REFERENCES**

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1) What caused John's weeping? Can you personally relate when things sometimes seem hopeless? What comfort did he receive?
- 2) What is the meaning of the scroll in Revelation 5? Why is Jesus the only one worthy to open it?
- 3) What does it mean that Satan is the god of this world, yet he is limited in power and God is sovereign over all? (cf. 2 Cor. 4:4, Eph. 2:2, John 12:31)

- 4) Read Isaiah 11:1-10. What does this prophecy about the "Root of Jesse" inform us about Jesus' title being the "Root of David" in Revelation 5? What will the nature of the world be when He redeems all things?
- 5) What circumstances in your life do you need to have reframed by gazing at the

Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, & the Lamb who was slain to redeem the world?

### FOR REFLECTION

Remember, as things get more difficult and evil seems to prevail in the world, you can lift up your head knowing that your redemption, and indeed, the redemption of *all* things is drawing near. Jesus is worthy to be praised! Place your hope in Him!
