MAIN POINTS, DEFINITIONS & APPLICATION

Merahefet:

The root word רָחַף (rachaf) means “to hover, flutter, vibrate, or move gently.

- But in Piel (verb pattern), the meaning becomes more intense and dynamic:

- **Merahefet (מְרַחֵף) describes not just passive hovering but active, vibrational motion, like a force being stirred or energized.

A charged hover/vibration / building toward action

√ Human emotion / HOLY EMOTION

Aspect	Human Emotion	HOLY EMOTION
Subjective	shaped by opinion, preference, culture or bias	Anchored — rooted in eternal truth and divine consistency
Limited	feels based on what it knows or has experienced (finite capacity)	Infinite — feels with infinite wisdom, intelligence and understanding
Power	can lead to change - but not always	leads to tranformation - Carries divine force — heals and aligns with sustained purpose

What are the mechanics behind God stirring Himself?

Lord, what moves you? - Yes... But more-so - How do you move AS ME.

Lord, how do you stir, charge or shake Yourself??

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New Testament:

Splagchnízomai

The Greek word σπλαγχνίζομαι (splagchnízomai) is a deep and powerful term in the New Testament that conveys intense, gut-wrenching compassion.

Meaning & Root

- Derived from σπλάγχνα (splágchna), which literally refers to the inner organs (heart, intestines, bowels).
- In ancient thought, the bowels were seen as the seat of deep emotions like mercy, love, and compassion.
- σπλαγχνίζομαι (Splagchnízomai) is the verb form, meaning to feel deep, visceral compassion—not just sympathy, but a profound movement of the heart and bowels that compels action.

Old Testament:

Rachamim is the Hebrew word most often translated as compassion, mercy, or tender love.

It expresses a **deep, tender emotional response**—particularly one that moves someone to act with kindness or protection, especially toward the vulnerable.

Root Word: רַחַם (Rechem) – Womb:

The root of rachamim is רַחַם (rechem), which literally means womb.

Rachamim is womb-like mercy —

the kind of compassion that holds, covers, and acts from the deepest place of love and connection.
