


BEYOND BELIEF SEED SERVICE

SUMMARY:

This teaching challenges us to move beyond mere belief into the transformative realm of knowing God. We discover that while salvation hinges on belief in Christ Jesus, we were never meant to remain just believers—we're called to become knowers, just as Jesus himself was not a believer but a knower.

The message unpacks the psychological and neurological foundations of belief, revealing how our beliefs are formed through repeated experiences, interpretations of those experiences and authority figures we trust.

Yet here's the profound truth: while human belief is developed over time through these mechanisms, Christ's knowing is **inherited**. When we accept Jesus, we receive a new heart—a spiritual organ where God's light shines, where His laws are inscribed and where the Holy Spirit resides.

SUMMARY:

This new heart gives us access to the mind of Christ and the capacity to know God intimately, not just believe concepts about Him.

The distinction is life-changing: believers are loyal but knowers are faithful. Believers will enter heaven but knowers will hear 'well done, good and faithful servant' and be entrusted with greater responsibility now and in the age to come.

We're encouraged to practice knowing with thanksgiving, believing that we know until we know that we know, functioning from a place of peace and divine understanding rather than constantly needing repeated experiences to validate our faith.

This is our invitation to experience the divine nature, to escape the corruption of worldly lusts and to have grace and peace multiplied in our lives through the knowledge of God.


KEY POINTS

- Salvation hinges on belief in Jesus Christ, all things are possible through belief and power is accessible to those who believe
- Jesus is not called a believer in Scripture; He is consistently described as a knower who operated from divine knowledge without mental effort
- Beliefs are formed through three mechanisms: repeated experiences, interpretation of those experiences, and authority/trust transfer leading to embodiment
- There are two types of belief: explicit (conscious, mental agreement) and implicit (embodied, automatic responses that show true conviction)
- Believers receive eternal life, but knowers **experience** eternal life both now and in eternity with greater reward

KEY POINTS

- All believers go to Heaven but knowers will experience Heaven differently
- Grace and peace are multiplied through the **knowledge** of God, not just belief
- Believers are loyal; knowers are faithful and can be entrusted with greater responsibility
- When believers are born again, they receive a **new heart** given by God in which He writes His word upon. – The Holy Spirit resides there. This is where God's knowledge was given and flows from within you
- Practicing thanksgiving in believing that you **know** is a key weapon for moving from belief to knowing


