### 1. GOING DEEPER

### **Esther 1 - 11**

<b>1a)</b> How does Esther's appointed <u>position</u> in the palace reassure you that God played an active part in her story and continues to play an active role in your own?
b) What personal experiences have led you to think that God was not present in your life?
c) How can the story of Esther (God Behind the Scenes) help you combat this feeling?
<b>2a)</b> The celebration of the feast of Purim is a reminder to the Jews of their deliverance from annihilation; as a Christian, what reminder can you create to remember God's deliverance for you?
<b>b)</b> Why is recording what God has done in your life so important? Why should these acts be passed on to future generations?
c) What verses can be used as encouragement while going through testing times? Why is the reciting of scripture helpful while going through the test?
<b>3a)</b> The Bible is full of examples of seemingly imperfect people, who were used by God. What lessons can we learn from these examples?
b) How can these examples be an encouragement while going through our tests?
c) What lessons have you learnt from the book of Esther?

#### **Inductive Bible Study Method**



Observation (What does the text say?)

This phase is about observing exactly what the text is saying.

Pretend you're an investigator who's just gathering the facts. Ask yourself the five W's and H: (Who, what, where, when, why, how).



# <u>Interpretation</u> (What does the text mean?

Discover what the author is trying to communicate. And to do this, you need to look at the context to

- What is the main theme and what is the meaning of key words:
- Examine cross references
- Compare translations
- Summarize the text
- Use commentaries (last resort)



# <u>Application</u> (How should this affect Me?)

Don't study the bible just for knowledge – study for application. If you stop at the interpretation stage, you are selling yourself short. Based on what you have learnt, ask yourself "How should this change the way I think, speak and behave?

Seek to identify if there are - Sins to confess; Promises to claim; Examples to follow; Actions to obey or Knowledge to grow in.
