Sermon Highlights

God opposes the proud and arrogant. To avoid being proud and arrogant, believers should seek to:

- Be Emotionally Stable
- Be Humble
- Be Sober Minded
- Be Good

- God opposes the proud and arrogant as can be seen in the disposition of Haman
- Pride is defined as feeling honored, satisfied, or happy about a fact.
 Arrogance is excessive pride in oneself often with contempt for others.
- Humility is having rightly placed confidence. Be humble and avoid the pride and arrogance of personal success.
- Hatred is an intoxicating emotion. It has the power to remove rational thought

Inductive Bible Study Method



<u>Observation</u> (What does the text say?)

This phase is about observing exactly what the text is saying.

Pretend you're an investigator who's just gathering the facts. Ask yourself the five W's and H: (Who, what, where, when, why, how).



<u>Interpretation</u> (What does the text mean?

Discover what the author is trying to communicate. And to do this, you need to look at the context to determine

- What is the main theme and what is the meaning of key words;
- Examine cross references
- Compare translations
- Summarize the text
- Use commentaries (last resort)



<u>Application</u> (How should this affect Me?)

Don't study the bible just for knowledge – study for application. If you stop at the interpretation stage, you are selling yourself short. Based on what you have learnt, ask yourself "How should this change the way I think, speak and behave?

Seek to identify if there are - Sins to confess; Promises to claim; Examples to follow; Actions to obey or Knowledge to grow in.
