Sermon Highlights

Since we are confident that God hears and answers prayers, we must:

- Let our requests be made known to God.
- Wait patiently on God's response.
- God Is always when things don't seem to be going our way.
- God is calling us to an attitude of prayerfulness, not just a time of prayer.
- Crying out to God Is an admission that we cannot solve our problems on our own and that we are dependent upon Him.
- We don't always receive what we want when we pray, but we can have the assurance that God always answers.
- The word wait in the Bible carries the idea of confident expectation and hope.

Ask yourself the five W's and H: (Who, what, where, when, why, how). Psalm 66:16-20 What I learned: **Interpretation** (What does the text mean? How I will Respond: Discover what the author is trying to communicate. And to do this, you need to look at the context to determine What is the main theme and what is the **meaning** of key Isaiah 40:30-31 Day What I learned: Examine cross references Compare translations How I will Respond: Summarize the text Use commentaries (last Application (How should this affect Me?) **Matthew 7:7-11** What I learned: Don't study the bible just for knowledge - study for application.
