Hebrews 11.5–6

5 By faith Enoch was taken away, and so he did not experience death. He was not to be found because God took him away. For before he was taken away, he was approved as one who pleased God.

6 Now without faith it is impossible to please God, since the one who draws near to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

Thought Questions for Discussion

1. Why do you think the Hebrew writer dedicated two verses to Enoch in particular?
2. In what ways do we, today, struggle with our faith like the Christians addressed in Hebrews?
3. What stands out to you about the way Enoch's story is told in Genesis 5?
4. How do you interpret the phrase, "Enoch walked with God; then he was not there because God took him"?
5. How do you define faith in your own life?
6. What does it mean to truly believe that God "is who He is"?

7. How does God reveal Himself to us today?
8. What can we infer about Enoch's life based on Jude 14-15?
9. Today, how can we be like Enoch and stand up to false teachings or influences?

Group Activity

Group Discussion: Divide into groups and discuss Enoch's steadfastness and daily communion with God in a world that was continuously deteriorating. What can we learn from this?

Scripture Dive: Examine the provided passages: John 3.16-17, Ephesians 1.3-8, Colossians 1.12-14. Discuss the promises of God and how they apply to our lives.
