Thought Questions for Discussion

Joshua 24.14-15 CSB

14 "Therefore, fear the Lord and worship him in sincerity and truth. Get rid of the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River and in Egypt, and worship the Lord.

15 But if it doesn't please you to worship the Lord, choose for yourselves today: Which will you worship—the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living? As for me and my family, we will worship the Lord."

- 1. Reflect on the significance of Joshua's original name "Hoshea" and the change to "Joshua". What does this reveal about the role of divine purpose in our identities?
- 2. In what ways can we emulate Joshua's dedication and service as seen during his time as Moses' assistant?
- 3. Contrast the response of Joshua and Caleb to the other ten spies. How does this speak to the role of faith in confronting challenges?
- 4. Discuss how Joshua's appointment as Moses' successor illustrates the principle of spiritual mentorship and succession planning in leadership.
- 5. What does "be strong and courageous" mean to you in the context of your personal life and spiritual walk?

- 6. How did Joshua's faith in God's promises affect his leadership decisions during key moments such as the crossing of the Jordan River?
- 7. Analyze the scenario of Joshua's prayer for the sun to stand still. How does this inform our understanding of prayer and God's power?
