

Episode 32 — When We Disagree

Text: Philippians 4:2–3 (CSB)

Episode Summary:

In this episode, Paul addresses a real conflict between two faithful women in the Philippian church. Philippians 4:2–3 reminds us that disagreement among believers is not new—but neither is the call to unity. Rather than taking sides, Paul urges reconciliation “in the Lord” and honors their shared labor in the gospel. This episode explores how an eternal perspective, humility, and a Christ-centered identity shape how we handle conflict.

Key Themes:

- Conflict among faithful believers
- Unity grounded in Christ
- Eternal perspective in present tension
- The role of community in reconciliation

Key Scripture:

“I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to agree in the Lord.” — Philippians 4:2 (CSB)

Takeaway Truth:

Christian unity is not based on preference or personality, but on shared allegiance to Christ and a shared eternal hope.

For Application:

If there is unresolved tension in your life, take a step toward reconciliation. Seek peace grounded in your shared identity in Christ and invite wise help if needed.

Series Focus:

This episode continues Philippians 4 by applying the call to stand firm in the Lord to real-life relationships, showing that unity is essential to faithful witness and enduring joy.
