

Here are the main points from Luke chapters 13 and 14:

Luke Chapter 13:

1. Jesus uses two incidents to emphasize the urgency of repentance, the Galileans killed by pilot, and the Tower of Siloam that fell.
2. Jesus heals a woman who had been crippled for 18 years on the Sabbath, sparking controversy.
3. Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a mustard seed and leaven, emphasizing its small beginnings but vast impact.
4. Jesus laments over Jerusalem and predicts its destruction.
5. Jesus heals a man with dropsy on the Sabbath and teaches about humility and hospitality.

Luke Chapter 14:

1. Jesus heals a man with dropsy on the Sabbath and teaches about humility and hospitality.
2. Jesus tells parables about taking the lowest place at a banquet and inviting the poor and needy.
3. Jesus teaches about the cost of discipleship and the need to count the cost before following Him.
4. Jesus emphasizes the importance of renouncing all possessions in order to be His disciple.
5. Jesus tells the parable of the great banquet, illustrating the inclusiveness of the Kingdom of God.
