

Here are the main points of Luke chapters 23 and 24:

Luke Chapter 23:

1. Jesus is brought before Pilate and Herod.
2. Pilate finds no fault in Jesus but allows the crowd to decide his fate.
3. The crowd demands Jesus to be crucified.
4. Jesus is crucified alongside two criminals.
5. Jesus forgives the criminals and promises one of them paradise.
6. Darkness covers the land during Jesus' crucifixion.
7. Jesus dies and the curtain of the temple is torn in two.
8. Joseph of Arimathea buries Jesus in a tomb.

Luke Chapter 24:

1. On the first day of the week, the women go to Jesus' tomb.
2. They find the stone rolled away and the tomb empty.
3. Two angels appear and tell the women that Jesus has risen.
4. The women tell the disciples, but they do not believe them.
5. Peter runs to the tomb and finds it empty.
6. Jesus appears to two disciples on the road to Emmaus.
7. Jesus appears to the disciples and shows them his wounds.
8. Jesus explains the Scriptures to the disciples.
9. Jesus ascends to heaven.

Questions for class

1. In Luke, chapter 23 we read about Jesus trial and crucifixion. Why do you think it was necessary for Jesus to go through such suffering and humiliation? How does this display of love and sacrifice impact our understanding of God's character?

2. In Luke, chapter 23, we see Jesus forgiving those who crucified him. How does this act a Forgiveness challenge our own understanding of forgiveness? How can we apply this lesson in our own lives today?

3. In Luke chapter 24, the women discover that Jesus has risen from the dead. How do you think this event changed the life of the disciples? How does the resurrection of Jesus give us hope and assurance in our faith?

4. The disciples initially struggled to believe the reports of Jesus resurrection. Why do you think they found it difficult to accept this miraculous event? How can we learn from their doubts and grow in our own faith?

5. in Luke chapter 24, Jesus appears to his disciples explains the Scriptures to them. How does this emphasize the importance of studying and understanding the word of God ? how can we approach Bible study in a way that deepens our relationship with Jesus?

6. The disciples hearts burn within them as Jesus open the Scriptures to them. How can we cultivate a similar passion for God's word in our own lives? What practices or habits can help us engage with the Scriptures more intentionally?

7. In Luke, chapter 24, Jesus commissions his disciples to be his witnesses to all nations. What does it mean to be a witness for Christ? How can we fulfill this commission in our daily lives?

8. Reflecting on the events of Luke, chapter 23, and chapter 24 how does the resurrection of Jesus impact our understanding of salvation? How does it give us hope for eternal life?
