



5-Day Devotional: Living Under Covenant

Day 1: Everybody Needs Saving

Reading: Romans 10:9-10; Ephesians 2:8-9

Devotional: Salvation is beautifully simple, yet profoundly life-changing. God doesn't make it complicated—believe in your heart that Jesus is Lord, confess with your mouth, and receive the gift of eternal life. The simplicity of this truth shouldn't diminish its power. Today, reflect on your own salvation moment. Have you accepted this gift? If so, who in your life still needs to hear this good news? The message is urgent because we're living in critical times. Don't let fear or awkwardness prevent you from sharing the most important message someone could ever hear. Salvation isn't about religious performance; it's about a relationship with Jesus Christ. With love and grace, not condemnation, reach out to someone today and share the hope you have.

Day 2: One Nation Under God

Reading: Psalm 33:12; 2 Chronicles 7:14

Devotional: Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord. This isn't just a patriotic sentiment—it's a spiritual principle that determines the destiny of nations. America was founded on biblical principles by people who sought God's guidance. When we recently rededicated our nation back to God, we acknowledged that our strength doesn't come from human wisdom, military might, or economic power, but from divine blessing. This applies personally too. Your life flourishes when God is truly Lord over every area. Is He Lord of your finances, relationships, career, and future? Or have you replaced His priesthood with your own preferences? National revival begins with personal consecration. Examine your heart today. Have you drifted from your first love? Return to covenant with God, and watch Him restore what the enemy has stolen.

Day 3: Outnumbered But Not Outmatched

Reading: 2 Chronicles 13:1-18; 2 Chronicles 15:1-15

Devotional: Abijah faced impossible odds—400,000 troops against 800,000. Yet he won decisively because God was with him. When you face overwhelming circumstances, remember this truth: the battle belongs to the Lord. Your cancer diagnosis, financial crisis, broken relationship, or family conflict may look insurmountable, but God specializes in impossible situations. Abijah's victory came through worship, proper spiritual alignment, and crying out to God. He didn't rely on military strategy alone; he called on the covenant-keeping God. What giant are you facing today? Stop looking at the size of your problem and start looking at the size of your God. Gather your faith, lift your voice in worship, and watch God defeat what outnumbers you. His covenant promises never fail when we align ourselves with His will and His ways.

Day 4: The Power of Covenant

Reading: Genesis 17:1-8; Hebrews 8:6-13

Devotional: A covenant is more than a contract—it's a sacred, binding relationship with mutual commitments. God established covenants with Noah, Abraham, Moses, and David, each revealing His faithfulness. The New Covenant through Jesus Christ is the culmination of God's promise to write His law on our hearts and forgive our sins completely. God never breaks covenant, though we often do. His grace covers our failures when we repent and return to Him. But there are conditions: "If you seek Him, He will be found by you; but if you forsake Him, He will forsake you." This isn't about earning salvation—it's about maintaining relationship. Are you keeping covenant with God? Are you seeking Him with your whole heart? Covenant relationship requires intentionality, faithfulness, and surrender. Renew your commitment today to walk in covenant obedience.

Day 5: Hope in the Midnight Hour

Reading: Romans 13:11-14; 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Devotional: We're living in the midnight hour—time is short, and Jesus is coming soon. This reality should create urgency, not panic. Like the priests who lit the lamps morning and evening, we must keep our spiritual lights burning brightly in increasing darkness. The world needs to see authentic Christianity lived out in love, power, and holiness. Don't be discouraged by cultural opposition or spiritual warfare. Remember, when Judah entered into covenant with all their heart, God gave them rest from their enemies on every side. The same God who delivered them will deliver you. Stand firm in faith, worship with passion, pray with persistence, and share the gospel with boldness. The darker it gets, the brighter your light shines. You're not here by accident—you're positioned for such a time as this. Walk in covenant, live in victory, and watch God move.
