- III. The Judgment of God's Old Covenant People
 - A. Lev 26:17-20; Deut 28-30; Is 24:3-6, 19-23; Joel 2:1-11, 28-32; Is 65:1-7
 - B. Final fulfillment of this judgment is seen in Jesus' day on that generation
 - i. Mt 21:28-32, 33-46; Lk 15:11-32; Lk 16:1-18, 19-31
 - ii. Mt 23:31-36; 23:37-24:51
- IV. The Restoration of God's People through the New Covenant
 - A. Is 51:15-16; 65:8-25; Jer 31:27-34
 - B. Heb 7-10
 - i. Christ is the one and permanent high priest (7:22-24)
 - ii. The work of Christ is everlasting and perfect (7:25)
 - iii. The Old Covenant administration was instituted to be a copy and shadow of the heavenly things (8:5)
 - iv. The New Covenant has been "enacted" or made law with better promises (8:6)
 - v. The Old Covenant was not faultless for it contained only in part what the New Covenant contains in full (8:7)
 - vi. The Superiority/Fulfillment Aspect of the New Covenant
 - a) It is not like the Old Covenant which was comprised of believers and unbelievers (8:8-9)
 - b) The New Covenant is comprised of regenerated believers (8:10)
 - c) All members of the New Covenant will internally know Yahweh (8:11)
 - d) All members of the New Covenant receive the forgiveness of their sins offered by the grace of God to his elect (Heb 8:12)
