Loyalty and courage are needed to protect God's work on earth

"David reigned over all Israel, doing what was just and right for all his people. Joab son of Zeruiah was over the army; Jehoshaphat son of Ahilud was recorder; Zadok son of Ahitub and Ahimelek son of Abiathar were priests; Seraiah was secretary; <u>Benaiah son of Jehoiada was</u> <u>over the Kerethites and Pelethites</u>; and David's sons were priests." 2 Samuel 8:15-18

"Benaiah son of Jehoiada, a valiant fighter from Kabzeel, performed great exploits. He struck down Moab's two mightiest warriors. He also went down into a pit on a snowy day and killed a lion. And he struck down a huge Egyptian. Although the Egyptian had a spear in his hand, Benaiah went against him with a club. He snatched the spear from the Egyptian's hand and killed him with his own spear. Such were the exploits of Benaiah son of Jehoiada; he too was as famous as the three mighty warriors. He was held in greater honor than any of the Thirty, but he was not included among the Three. And David put him in charge of his bodyguard." 2 Samuel 23:20-23

"Another time, on a snowy day, he chased a lion down into a pit and killed it." 2 Samuel 23:20b

Lion Chasing Skills

1. Loyalty *recognizes* the *Greatness* of God

A. God's Greatness

C. God's Glory

"They tell of the glory of your kingdom and speak of your might, ¹² so that all people may know of your mighty acts and the glorious splendor of your kingdom." Psalm 145:11-12

D. God's Guarantee

"Your kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and your dominion endures through all generations." *Psalm 145:13*

E. God's Grace

"The Lord upholds all who fall and lifts up all who are bowed down." Psalm 145:14

2. Courage means I face my fears

"So I tell you, don't worry about everyday life—whether you have enough food, drink, and clothes. Doesn't life consist of more than food and clothing? Look at the birds. They don't need to plant or harvest or put food in barns because your heavenly Father feeds them. And you are far more valuable to him than they are. Can all your worries add a single moment to your life? Of course not. "And why worry about your clothes? Look at the lilies and how they grow. They don't work or make their clothing, yet Solomon in all his glory was not dressed as beautifully as they are. And if God cares so wonderfully for flowers that are here today and gone tomorrow, won't he more surely care for you? You have so little faith! "So don't worry about having enough food or drink or clothing. Why be like the pagans who are so deeply concerned about these things? Your heavenly Father already knows all your needs, and he will give you all you need from day to day if you live for him and make the Kingdom of God your primary concern. "So don't worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring its own worries. Today's trouble is enough for today. Matthew 6:25-34

3. Courage helps me to seize the opportunity

"Live wisely among those who are not believers, and make the most of every opportunity." Colossians 4:5

"So be careful how you live. Don't live like fools, but like those who are wise. Make the most of every opportunity in these evil days. Don't act thoughtlessly, but understand what the Lord wants you to do." Ephesians 5:15-17

4. Loyalty relies on God

Stop asking God *to get us out of* difficult circumstances and start asking Him what He wants *us to get out of* those difficult circumstances.
