STUDY GUIDE:

STEP ONE: Icebreaker (Optional):

• Where is your favorite place in the entire world and why?

STEP TWO: Prayer & Scripture Reading

- Ask someone in your group to pray to open your time together.
- Ask another person to read Jeremiah 18:1-4; 19:1-13.

STEP THREE: Discuss Questions

- 1. What was challenging, encouraging, confusing, or stood out most to you from this past weekend's teaching?
- 2. In these texts from Jeremiah, God is continually trying to woo his people to "return" to Him. What makes you or others you know hesitant to come towards God?
- 3. In verses 1-6 God shows Himself as the Potter making the clay (people) how He sees fit. Does God's sovereignty (God doing as He chooses) encourage or discourage you? Why?
- 4. In chapter 19, God gives Jeremiah the illustration of the "shattered" pottery. How does that illustrate God's judgment on His people?
- 5. Look again at Jeremiah 18 and 19. What reasons does God give for bringing judgment on His people? In what ways do you see yourself and/or our society going after other "idols?"
- 6. Read Jeremiah 18:7-8, 11. What is God's loving response to those who would return/repent and come back to Him?
- 7. For those who trust in Jesus, how does God enact His judgment on Christ on the cross? How does this enable people to ultimately be in God's presence?

STEP FOUR: Prayer

• Consider how God might be calling you to return to Him in this season. Don't delay! Have someone in the group close in prayer.
