MESSAGE NOTES:

Romans 10:13-17

¹³for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

¹⁴How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? ¹⁵And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

¹⁶But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?" ¹⁷Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ.

STUDY GUIDE:

STEP ONE: Read Romans 10:13-17 and pray to open your time together in God's word.

STEP TWO: (Optional) Icebreaker: Share about a cross-cultural experience that impacted you.

STEP THREE: Discuss Questions

1. What stood out to you the most in this weekend's teaching? What was challenging, encouraging, or confusing to you?
2. What themes or repeated words/phrases stood out to you from Romans 10:13-17?
3. Paul says in Romans 10:10: "For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved." What else does Paul say in chapter 10 about your mouth?
4. In verse 14, Paul asks the question, "And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" As a follower of Christ, do you consider yourself one who preaches or shares the gospel?
5. What does "sharing the good news" look like in a practical way for your life?
6. Paul quotes Isaiah 52:7 when he says "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news" (Romans 10:10). The Prophet Isaiah was speaking to the people who would bring exiles out of captivity in Babylon. How does this parallel with the good news shared with people who don't yet know Jesus and the salvation He offers?
