- 5. Do you think people in our culture are too quick to leave a church when conflict arises? When is the right time to leave a church?
- 6. What makes it so easy to be a cynic?

- 7. What sorts of habits can help us put on love like we put on clothes?
- 8. What are the pros & cons of having a diverse church where different worldviews have to co-exist (versus a more uniform group)?
- 9. What are some easy, Christ-like ways to promote peace at Creekside?
