

## Easy Evangelism

#### Part 2

Tonight, we continue our evangelism series as we begin to understand what holds us back in the area of evangelism. Let me begin tonight by sharing the story of the first time I personally shared the Gospel, and we'll see if you can relate.

#### Part 2: The greatest <u>deterrent</u>- <u>fear!</u>

#### 1. Jitters on the battlefield

- Reminder, our <u>silence</u> is Satan's <u>goal</u> & his favorite <u>tool</u>. He may have lost the war for your soul, but he wants to keep you silent & self-absorbed.
- Evangelism is a <u>threat</u> to him. His <u>destination</u> is hell, and he wants as many men & women as he can find to go there with him.
- Are you an introvert, naturally?
- Are you shy & not very sure of yourself?
- The enemy wishes to exploit these natural tendencies to keep us quiet.
- 2 Cor. 12:9-10; "But He said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about My weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong."
- God's grace is enough to overcome our weakness.
- Fear does not come from the Lord, but it is another tool of the enemy.

## 2. A <u>spiritual</u> discipline?

- What if I told you that sharing your faith is a <u>spiritual</u> discipline akin to prayer, studying the Word, fasting, church attendance, etc.?
- When we practice these disciplines, we grow and mature in our faith and relationship with Christ. They help us become more like Christ.

- "Practice makes perfect!" Consider the sports training of an athlete.
- Therefore, it's easy to see why we're uneasy with sharing the Gospel, because we don't practice this discipline regularly. The more we do, the easier it is.
- Turn to Acts 4, and let's understand a Gospel presentation that ensues after a miraculous healing.
- Acts 4:20; "For we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard."
- In the face of imprisonment or even death, Peter & John weren't silent.

#### 3. The doctrine of exclusivity

- No better verse that makes this doctrine apparent than **John 14:6**; "I am THE way, and THE truth, and THE life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."
- Jesus isn't A way, or A truth, or A life, He is THE ONLY WAY, TRUTH, & LIFE.
- One pathway is hard for humanity to accept in a world filled with <u>voices</u> and <u>choices</u>. People are <u>pluralists</u>; we like choice. People are also <u>inclusivists</u> if they are in the club. People are <u>universalists</u> when it benefits them.
- Many see this as old-fashioned and narrow-minded, meant to **exclude** people or to make them feel **guilty**.
- Yet, without Jesus, there is no death on the cross and no Resurrection.
- With no perfect shed blood, no atoning sacrifice, no imputation of righteousness, and no forgiveness of sins, we can't enter heaven, into the eternal presence of a holy God.
- Consider this when you speak to those who doubt Jesus' exclusive claims:
  - No one else lived a perfect life.
  - No one else died for you and your sins.
  - No one else rose from the dead and ascended on high by His own will.
  - No one else is the God-Man, both fully God and fully man.
  - No one else can take us to heaven.
  - No one else provides the way of grace and forgiveness through faith.

#### 4. Someone else is better!

- Turn to Exodus 3 & 4. This is the calling of Moses as the deliverer and mediator of Israel. God was going to use Moses amazingly.

- When God calls someone, He always equips them for the work they are sent to perform on His behalf.
- Notice Moses's <u>excuses</u>: I'm not <u>important</u> enough (3:11), I don't even know your <u>name</u> (3:13), they won't <u>believe</u> me (4:1), I'm not a <u>public</u> speaker (4:10), God, send someone <u>else</u> (4:13).
- We have <u>excuses</u> too: I'm not called to do that, I'm too busy, I'm an introvert, that's not my spiritual gift, others are more effective, and I don't know enough. Christians are skilled at evangelism <u>deflection</u>.
- Here's the truth: you might be uncomfortable, but isn't your momentary discomfort worth someone's eternal security? You might not know enough, which is only a problem if the results are up to you! You might be busy, but we always find time for the things that are most important to us. There may be others who are more adept and gifted in this area, but that doesn't alleviate the command and demand of obedience for you. You may be an introvert, slow of speech and tongue, but if God can speak through a donkey, He can speak through you!
