

Easy Evangelism

Part 4

Tonight, we continue our evangelism series. Now that we have a full understanding of the Gospel, it's important to know how and when to share it. For many years, the Church has been derided as a 'holy huddle'. We meet, week in and week out, and grow in our knowledge but lack in our application. Many churches are more akin to libraries, repositories of knowledge that have all the answers but require someone to come in and do their own research. Tonight, let's see who & how we should be spreading the Gospel.

Part 4: The <u>relational</u> approach.

1. <u>Campaigns</u> & <u>programs</u>

- Many of us remember old-time <u>revivals</u>.
- Many of us remember some style of door-to-door visitation.
- Many of us remember evangelism/apologetics training seminars or classes.
- Many pastors beg their people to share their faith every week.
- Many churches spend resources on advertising & mailouts.
- Many churches are <u>programmatically</u> driven, trying to attract new people with the <u>departments</u> or <u>events</u> they offer.
- Many churchgoers attend a particular church because of a worship style, a preacher/preaching style, buildings/campus, schedule, friendliness, or location. We often treat choosing a church like choosing a <u>restaurant</u>.
- However, did you know that studies consistently show the number one reason why people attend a particular church is because of <u>friends</u> or <u>relatives</u> who go there. People <u>go</u> to church with people they <u>know</u>.

2. Relationship <u>matters!</u>

People like to <u>belong</u>! Generally speaking, humans desire <u>community</u>.

- A church should be a faith *family*, filled with kind and considerate people who are involved in each other's lives.
- We just reviewed the common reasons why churchgoers attend a church.
- But what about non-churchgoers? How can we reach out to the unchurched? The answer is still relationship.
- A relationship allows you, and earns the right to speak into a person's life.
- <u>Proverbs 27:6</u>; "Wounds form a friend can be trusted, but an enemy multiplies kisses."
- We simply don't trust <u>strangers</u>. We don't accept their judgment. We don't trust their intentions. And their suggestions have little weight.

3. Prayer is necessary!

- "Prayer is the foundation and centerpiece of evangelism."
- Before we learn <u>phrases</u> and <u>strategies</u>, let us stop and ask for God's grace in representing Him. Pray for freedom from <u>hypocrisy</u> in our own lives.
- "Evangelism is most effective when a person's lifestyle matches their words."
- To evangelize without prayer relegates our evangelism to just another human endeavor with little power. Prayer is our greatest power <u>source</u>.
- We can attempt to leverage our relationships for Christ, but we first need to engage in prayer and ask for a <u>divine</u> appointment.
- Turn to Matthew 9:35-38. "Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest fields."
- Pray for God to send more workers into the field.
- Pray for more of our church members to answer the Great Command.
- Pray for more opportunities to share the Gospel, divine appointments.
- Then realize, we are the answer to our own prayers!
- It's God's *field*, His *harvest*, and we are His *harvesters*!
- Pray, because evangelism is spiritual warfare.
- Turn to Ephesians 6:10-20. "Pray also for me, that whenever I open my mouth, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the Gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should."
- If Paul thought it was necessary to pray for the word, for courage and boldness, for a lack of fear, then shouldn't we think so too?
