1 Corinthians 15:10


Paul understood the shift: He worked, but grace produced. He moved, but grace empowered. He yielded, and grace reigned.

7-DAY DEVOTIONAL

Theme: *When the Kingdoms Shift: Grace Takes the Throne* **Scripture Anchor:** Romans 5:21

DAY 1 — THE KINGDOMS SHIFT

Scripture: Romans 5:21 **Focus:** A divine transfer of power has taken place. Sin once reigned, but grace now sits on the throne. **Meditation:** I am no longer under the government of sin. **Prayer:** Father, open my eyes to the shift You have made in my life. **Declaration:** *Grace reigns over me.*

DAY 2 — UNDER NEW GOVERNMENT

Scripture: Colossians 1:13 **Focus:** You have been translated out of Adam's kingdom into Christ's kingdom. **Meditation:** I live under the authority of Christ, not the limitations of Adam. **Prayer:** Lord, help me walk in the reality of my new citizenship. **Declaration:** *I am governed by grace.*


DAY 3 — THE PROPHECY OF SIN

Scripture: Romans 5:12 **Focus:** Sin is not just behavior—it is a kingdom, a law, a ruling power. **Meditation:** Sin's voice no longer has jurisdiction over me. **Prayer:** Break every lingering influence of the old kingdom. **Declaration:** *Sin shall not have dominion over me.*

DAY 4 — THE PROPHECY OF GRACE

Scripture: Titus 2:11–12 **Focus:** Grace is not leniency—it is divine empowerment and government. **Meditation:** Grace teaches, strengthens, and elevates me. **Prayer:** Lord, let Your grace empower every area of my life. **Declaration:** *Grace is my strength and my supply.*


