

7-Day Devotional: Encountering His Character Through His Names

Day 1 - Elohim: The Creator Who Still Creates

- Scripture: Genesis 1:1 "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth."
- **Reflection**: Elohim is still creating—restoring dreams, rebuilding lives, and shaping destinies. You are His masterpiece in progress.
- **Prayer**: "Elohim, breathe new life into every barren place. Create beauty from my brokenness."
- Affirmation: "I am divinely designed. Elohim is crafting something glorious in me."

Day 2 - El Roi: The God Who Sees Me

- Scripture: Genesis 16:13 "You are the God who sees me."
- **Reflection**: God sees beyond your surface—He sees your heart, your tears, your silent prayers. You are never invisible to Him.
- Prayer: "El Roi, thank You for seeing me. Let Your vision of me silence every voice of rejection."
- Affirmation: "I am seen. I am known. I am deeply loved by El Roi."

Day 3 - Yahweh Yireh: The Lord Will Provide

- Scripture: Genesis 22:14 "The Lord will provide."
- **Reflection**: Provision is already in motion. What you need tomorrow, God has already prepared today.
- Prayer: "Yahweh Yireh, open my eyes to Your provision. Let me trust Your timing and abundance."
- Affirmation: "I walk in divine supply. My God provides before I even ask."





Day 4 - Yahweh Rapha: The Lord Who Heals

- Scripture: Exodus 15:26 "I am the Lord who heals you."
- **Reflection**: Healing is not just physical—it's emotional, relational, and generational. Rapha restores wholeness.
- **Prayer**: "Yahweh Rapha, heal every wound and restore every broken place in me and my family."
- Affirmation: "Healing is my inheritance. Wholeness is my portion."

Day 5 - Yahweh Shalom: The Lord Is Peace

- Scripture: Judges 6:24 "The Lord is Peace."
- **Reflection**: Shalom is more than calm—it's divine order, completeness, and rest. Let His peace rule your heart.
- **Prayer**: "Yahweh Shalom, let Your peace invade every storm and settle every anxious thought."
- Affirmation: "I am anchored in divine peace. Chaos cannot dwell where Shalom reigns."

Day 6 - Yahweh Nissi: The Lord My Banner

- **Scripture**: Exodus 17:15 "The Lord is my Banner."
- **Reflection**: His banner over you is love, victory, and identity. You are marked by covenant and destined for triumph.
- Prayer: "Yahweh Nissi, wave Your banner over my battles. Let Your name be my victory."
- Affirmation: "I am covered by covenant. I am marked by victory."

Day 7 - Yahweh Shammah: The Lord Is There

• Scripture: Ezekiel 48:35 – "The Lord is There."





- **Reflection**: God is not distant—He is present. His nearness is your strength, your comfort, and your confidence.
- **Prayer**: "Yahweh Shammah, dwell in every space I occupy. Let Your presence be my atmosphere."
- Affirmation: "I am never alone. Yahweh Shammah is with me always."

Elohim - Creator God

• Meaning: The Strong Creator; God of power and might (Genesis 1:1)





• **Prayer**: "Elohim, create in me a clean heart and renew Your divine purpose in my life."

Yahweh - I AM

- Meaning: The Self-Existent One; Eternal and Unchanging (Exodus 3:14)
- Prayer: "Yahweh, be present in every moment of my life. You are all I need."

El Shaddai – God Almighty

- Meaning: All-Sufficient One; God of abundance and strength (Genesis 17:1)
- **Prayer**: "El Shaddai, pour out Your strength and provision over every area of my life."

El Elyon – Most High God

- Meaning: Sovereign and Supreme over all (Genesis 14:19)
- Prayer: "El Elyon, reign over my thoughts, my decisions, and my destiny."

El Olam - Everlasting God

- Meaning: God of eternity; timeless and faithful (Genesis 21:33)
- Prayer: "El Olam, anchor me in Your eternal promises and unchanging love."

2 El Gibbor – Mighty God

- Meaning: Warrior God; Champion and Defender (Isaiah 9:6)
- Prayer: "El Gibbor, fight my battles and surround me with Your victorious power."

El Roi - God Who Sees

• **Meaning**: The God who sees and understands (Genesis 16:13)





• **Prayer**: "El Roi, thank You for seeing me in every season. Let me feel Your watchful care."

Yahweh Yireh - The Lord Will Provide

- **Meaning:** Provider and Sustainer (Genesis 22:14)
- **Prayer**: "Yahweh Yireh, meet every need—spiritual, emotional, and physical—with Your abundance."

Yahweh Shalom - The Lord Is Peace

- **Meaning:** Source of peace and wholeness (Judges 6:24)
- **Prayer**: "Yahweh Shalom, calm every storm and fill my heart with Your perfect peace."

Yahweh Nissi - The Lord My Banner

- Meaning: God who gives victory and identity (Exodus 17:15)
- Prayer: "Yahweh Nissi, raise Your banner over me. Let Your name be my victory."

Yahweh Tsidkenu - The Lord Our Righteousness

- Meaning: God who makes us right and just (Jeremiah 23:6)
- Prayer: "Yahweh Tsidkenu, clothe me in Your righteousness and guide me in truth."

Yahweh Rapha – The Lord Who Heals

- **Meaning**: Healer of body, soul, and spirit (Exodus 15:26)
- Prayer: "Yahweh Rapha, release Your healing power over every wound and weakness."





Yahweh Shammah - The Lord Is There

- Meaning: Ever-present God (Ezekiel 48:35)
- Prayer: "Yahweh Shammah, dwell in my home, my heart, and every place I go."
