

**Introduction** → The point of Jesus' coming, death, and resurrection: To drive in my main verse Hebrews 10:26-29 - Tell them this sequential historical event

I. Sin and Separation from God

- The Bible teaches that all humans have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23)
- The penalty for sin is death and eternal separation from God. (Romans 6:23; Revelation 20:14-15)

II. Jesus' Sacrifice on the Cross

- God, out of his great love for humanity, sent his Son Jesus to die on the cross as a sacrifice for our sins. (John 3:16; Romans 5:8)
- Through his death, Jesus took upon himself the punishment that we deserved and made it possible for us to be reconciled with God. (2 Corinthians 5:18-19)

III. The Resurrection and Victory over Death

- After Jesus died on the cross, he was buried in a tomb, but on the third day, he rose from the dead, demonstrating his power over sin and death. (Mark 16:6; Luke 24:46; 1 Corinthians 15:4)
- Through his resurrection, Jesus offers us the hope of eternal life and a new relationship with God. (John 11:25-26; Romans 6:5-11)

IV. The Call to Faith and Repentance

- To receive the benefits of Jesus' sacrifice and resurrection, we must place our faith in him and repent of our sins. (Acts 3:19; Romans 10:9)
- This involves turning away from our sinful ways and turning towards God, trusting in Jesus as our Lord and Savior. (Ephesians 2:8-9; Colossians 2:6-7)

**Main Body: Hebrews 10:26-31 → No More Messiah**

26 If we deliberately keep on sinning after we have received the knowledge of the truth, no sacrifice for sins is left,

27 but only a fearful expectation of judgment and of raging fire that will consume the enemies of God.

28 Anyone who rejected the law of Moses died without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses.

29 How much more severely do you think someone deserves to be punished who has trampled the Son of God underfoot, who has treated as an unholy thing the blood of the covenant that sanctified them, and who has insulted the Spirit of grace?

30 For we know him who said, "It is mine to avenge; I will repay,"<sup>[d]</sup> and again, "The Lord will judge his people."<sup>[e]</sup>

31 It is a dreadful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.

Points:

**1. Jesus Christ's sacrifice is sufficient:**

Hebrews 10:26

-26 If we deliberately keep on sinning after we have received the knowledge of the truth, no sacrifice for sins is left,

-states that there is no longer any sacrifice for sins if we continue to sin deliberately. This means that if we reject the sacrifice of Jesus Christ and continue to sin deliberately, we are rejecting the only means of forgiveness that God has provided for us. Therefore, we must acknowledge the sufficiency of Jesus' sacrifice and turn away from sin.

Key Notes/Verses:

- You don't need money to buy goats and sheep in exchange for our sins
- Hebrews 9:12: "He did not enter by means of the blood of goats and calves; but he entered the Most Holy Place once for all by his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption."
- Hebrews 9:26: "But he has appeared once for all at the culmination of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself."
- 1 John 1:7: "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin."
- The grace of God is for all, and for the payment of our sins is His blood. Therefore, don't abuse that Grace, and trample His blood by sinning again. Make the value of it by living a Holy[Dami kasi natatakot rito pero]; (Holiness means: Set Apart Life from the World)

**2. God's Judgment is Real:**

Hebrews 10:27

-27 but only a fearful expectation of judgment and of raging fire that will consume the enemies of God.

-reminds us that there is a fearful expectation of judgment for those who reject the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. This is because God is just and will not let sin go unpunished. Therefore, we must recognize the seriousness of sin and the consequences of rejecting God's mercy.

Key Notes/Verses:

- Hebrews 10:30-31: "For we know him who said, 'It is mine to avenge; I will repay,' and again, 'The Lord will judge his people.' It is a dreadful thing to fall into the hands of the living God."
- Romans 6:23: "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."
- Let us not take this lightly, and be serious to walk uprightly in the sight of God

- 2 Corinthians 5:10: "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each of us may receive what is due us for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad."
- In everything we do, it is accounted for. Lahat yan may judgement sa Lord.
- Hindi kasi pwedeng nag lalakad ka ung Kanang paa mo patungo sa Lord, at yung other paa is going towards the desires of the flesh

### 3. The Holy Spirit's guidance is Necessary:

Hebrews 10:39

**39** But we do not belong to those who shrink back and are destroyed, but to those who have faith and are saved.

encourages us to persevere in faith and not shrink back, even in the face of persecution and suffering. This is because we have confidence that Jesus has already made the perfect sacrifice for our sins and that we can approach God with confidence through him. Therefore, we must continue to trust in Jesus and live a life of faith, even when it is difficult.

#### Key Notes/Verses:

- **Hebrews 12:1-2:** "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer, and perfecter of faith."
- Iwan mo na ngayon, Mag karoon ka ng Desisyon na Palayaain ang Sarili mo mula sa Sumpa ng Kasalanan
- **James 1:12:** "Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him."

- **1 Corinthians 15:58:** "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain."

Outro →

Galatians 5:16-25

**16** So I say, let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves. **17** The sinful nature wants to do evil, which is just the opposite of what the Spirit wants. And the Spirit gives us desires that are the opposite of what the sinful nature desires. These two forces are constantly fighting each other, so you are not free to carry out your good intentions. **18** But

when you are directed by the Spirit, you are not under obligation to the law of Moses.

**19** When you follow the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: sexual immorality, impurity, lustful pleasures, **20** idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, **21** envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will not inherit the Kingdom of God.

**22** But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, **23** gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!

**24 Those who belong to Christ Jesus have nailed the passions and desires of their sinful nature to his cross and crucified them there. 25** Since we are living by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit's leading in every part of our lives.

Conclusion:

The sacrifice of Jesus Christ is central to our faith and is what makes communion possible. Through his sacrifice, we have been forgiven of our sins and can approach God with confidence.

As we eat the bread and drink the wine during communion, we are reminded of the sacrifice of Jesus and are invited to participate in it spiritually. Just as Jesus' body was broken and his blood was shed for the forgiveness of our sins (1 Corinthians 11:23-24, Matthew 26:28), we are invited to receive his sacrifice by faith and to live in light of its power (Hebrews 10:12-14, 17-18). Therefore, let us approach the communion table with reverence and awe, recognizing the sacrifice that was made on our behalf (Hebrews 12:28-29) and committing ourselves to live in faith and obedience to God (1 Corinthians 11:26).

Declaration

Romans 6:1-11

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Well then, should we keep on sinning so that God can show us more and more of his wonderful grace? **2** Of course not! Since we have died to sin, how can we continue to live in it? **3** Or have you forgotten that when we were joined with Christ Jesus in baptism, we joined him in his death? **4** For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives.

**5** Since we have been united with him in his death, we will also be raised to life as he was. **6** We know that our old sinful selves were crucified with Christ so that sin might lose its power in our lives. We are no longer slaves to sin. **7** For when we died with Christ we were set free from the power of sin. **8** And since we died with Christ, we know we will also live with him. **9** We are sure

of this because Christ was raised from the dead, and he will never die again. Death no longer has any power over him. 10 When he died, he died once to break the power of sin. But now that he lives, he lives for the glory of God. 11 So you also should consider yourselves to be dead to the power of sin and alive to God through Christ Jesus.
