The book of Ephesians takes us through God's eternal plan for mankind. The first three chapters concentrate on salvation, which is both for Jews and Gentiles alike. They show the mystery of God hidden for ages, which now has been made known. They outline what we should believe. The last three chapters move on to look at the implications of the new life we have in Jesus. They focus on the church and then how we should respond as individuals and as families.

Therefore I, the prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk worthy of the calling you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, accepting one another in love, diligently keeping the unity of the Spirit with the peace that binds us. There is one body and one Spirit just as you were called to one hope at your calling one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. Now grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of the Messiah's gift. (Ephesians 4:1-7, HCSB)

The work of Christ brings all these things together. Jesus left the earth physically when he ascended, but did not leave us bereft and alone. He placed us in a family, left the Holy Spirit to strengthen us, and gave us gifts to equip the church and build us up.

And He personally gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, for the training of the saints in the work of ministry, to build up the body of Christ. (Ephesians 4:11-12, HCSB)

The Church is both unified and diverse. We are called to be one, but also, we all have a different part to play. There is a purpose behind these different roles, they are not there just to elevate certain people for the sake of it. They are given for the good of the whole body, to build up individuals and see God's kingdom extended.
