Sermon Notes – A Legacy That Will Last Forever

Key Scriptures: 2 Kings 2:1-4, 2 Kings 2:11-14, 1 Kings 19:19, 1 Kings 19:21, 2 Timothy 2:2

1. A Legacy Begins with a
Elijah found Elisha while he was (1 Kings 19:19). Elisha left everything to God's call (1 Kings 19:21). A lasting legacy begins when we say to God.
2. A Legacy Requires
Elijah tested Elisha's by saying "stay here" (2 Kings 2:1–4). Elisha refused to quit, showing and commitment. A true legacy is not built in a — it takes faithfulness over time.
3. A Legacy Passes on a
Elijah's mantle represented his and calling. Elisha asked for a portion of Elijah's spirit (2 Kings 2:11–14). We are called to the faith, not just keep it for ourselves.
4. A Legacy Involves
Elisha sacrificed his oxen and his plow (1 Kings 19:21). True legacy demands of the old life. You can't step into your if you hold on to your past.
5. A Legacy Multiplies Through
Paul told Timothy to teach faithful who would teach others also (2 Timothy 2:2). Legacy is about, not accumulation. What God gives you is meant to be to others.
6. A Legacy that Lasts Forever is Rooted in
Obedience, faith, and to Christ. Earthly success fades, but impact lasts forever. Our goal is to hear Jesus say, "Well done, good and faithful"
