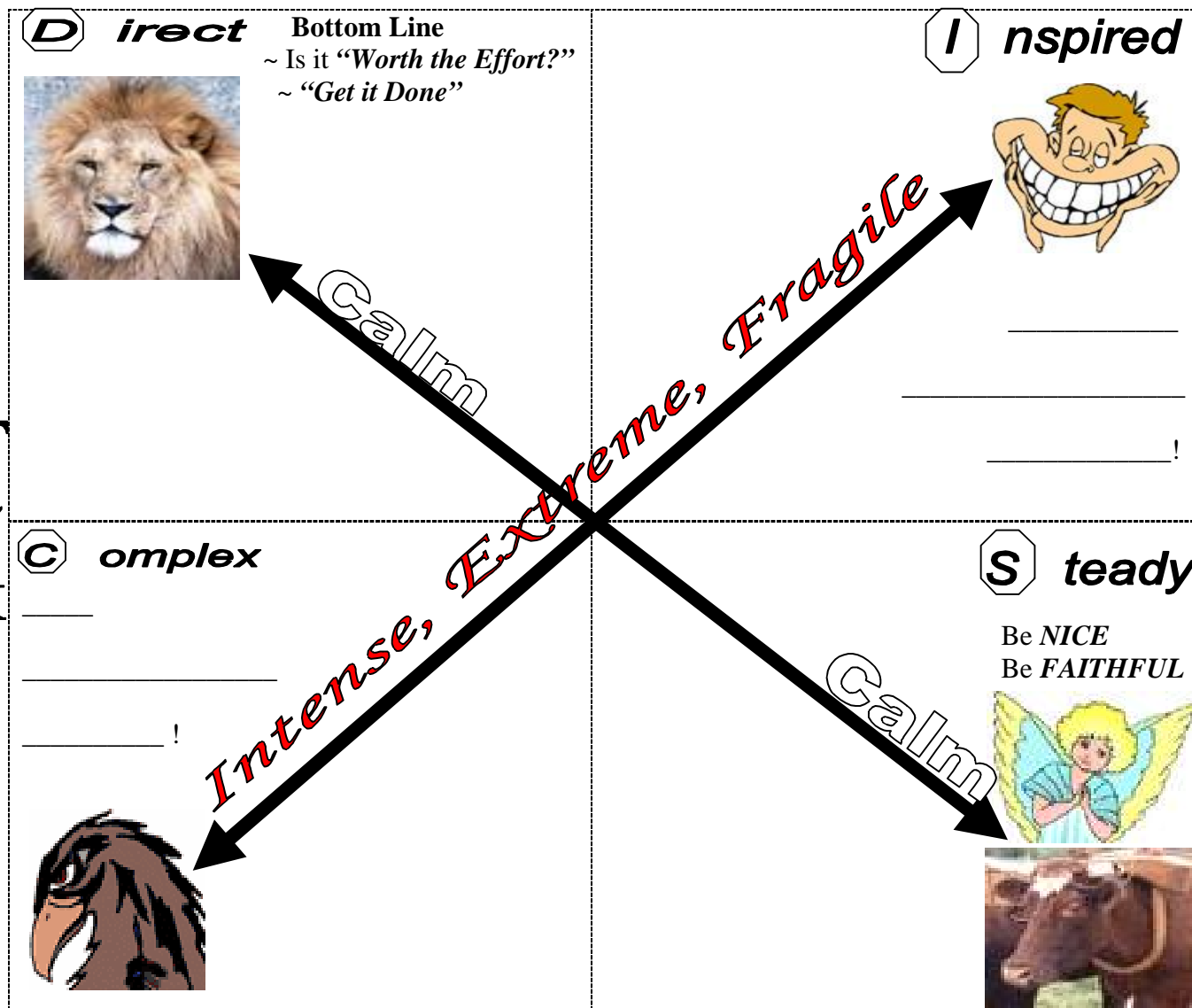

4. Lions do not WASTE their Roars(Tempers)

Please note that the mentions of a Lion's Roar does not indicate a constant temper. The key message of a lion's roar is that a Lion roars when he is about to KILL something. A High D does not care to fight. They don't LIKE to ARGUE. They roar when they have to kill something every 3-8 days. Other than that, they are fairly quiet animals.
