

## 1 Samuel 10:1-8

<sup>1</sup> Then Samuel took a flask of oil and poured it on Saul's head and kissed him, saying, "Has not the LORD anointed you leader over his inheritance? <sup>2</sup> When you leave me today, you will meet two men near Rachel's tomb, at Zelzah on the border of Benjamin. They will say to you, 'The donkeys you set out to look for have been found. And now your father has stopped thinking about them and is worried about you. He is asking, "What shall I do about my son?" '

<sup>3</sup> "Then you will go on from there until you reach the great tree of Tabor. Three men going up to God at Bethel will meet you there. One will be carrying three young goats, another three loaves of bread, and another a skin of wine. <sup>4</sup> They will greet you and offer you two loaves of bread, which you will accept from them.

<sup>5</sup> "After that you will go to Gibeah of God, where there is a Philistine outpost. As you approach the town, you will meet a procession of prophets coming down from the high place with lyres, tambourines, flutes and harps being played before them, and they will be prophesying. <sup>6</sup> The Spirit of the LORD will come upon you in power, and you will prophesy with them; and you will be changed into a different person. <sup>7</sup> Once these signs are fulfilled, do whatever your hand finds to do, for God is with you.

<sup>8</sup> "Go down ahead of me to Gilgal. I will surely come down to you to sacrifice burnt offerings and fellowship offerings, but you must wait seven days until I come to you and tell you what you are to do."

#### 1 Samuel 11

#### Saul Rescues the City of Jabesh

<sup>1</sup> Nahash the Ammonite went up and besieged Jabesh Gilead. And all the men of Jabesh said to him, "Make a treaty with us, and we will be subject to you." <sup>2</sup> But Nahash the Ammonite replied, "I will make a treaty with you only on the condition that I gouge out the right eye of every one of you and so bring disgrace on all Israel."

<sup>3</sup> The elders of Jabesh said to him, "Give us seven days so we can send messengers throughout Israel; if no one comes to rescue us, we will surrender to you." <sup>4</sup> When the messengers came to Gibeah of Saul and reported these terms to the people, they all wept aloud. <sup>5</sup> Just then Saul was returning from the fields, behind his oxen, and he asked, "What is wrong with the people? Why are they weeping?" Then they repeated to him what the men of Jabesh had said.

<sup>6</sup> When Saul heard their words, the Spirit of God came upon him in power, and he burned with anger. <sup>7</sup> He took a pair of oxen, cut them into pieces, and sent the pieces by messengers throughout Israel, proclaiming, "This is what will be done to the oxen of anyone who does not follow Saul and Samuel." Then the terror of the LORD fell on the people, and they turned out as one man. <sup>8</sup> When Saul mustered them at Bezek, the men of Israel numbered three hundred thousand and the men of Judah thirty thousand.

<sup>9</sup> They told the messengers who had come, "Say to the men of Jabesh Gilead, 'By the time the sun is hot tomorrow, you will be delivered.' "When the messengers went and reported this to the men of Jabesh, they were elated. <sup>10</sup> They said to the Ammonites, "Tomorrow we will surrender to you, and you can do to us whatever seems good to you."

<sup>11</sup> The next day Saul separated his men into three divisions; during the last watch of the night they broke into the camp of the Ammonites and slaughtered them until the heat of the day. Those who survived were scattered, so that no two of them were left together.

#### Saul Confirmed as King

<sup>12</sup> The people then said to Samuel, "Who was it that asked, 'Shall Saul reign over us?' Bring these men to us and we will put them to death."

<sup>13</sup> But Saul said, "No one shall be put to death today, for this day the LORD has rescued Israel."

<sup>14</sup> Then Samuel said to the people, "Come, let us go to Gilgal and there reaffirm the kingship."

<sup>15</sup> So all the people went to Gilgal and confirmed Saul as king in the presence of the LORD. There they sacrificed fellowship offerings before the LORD, and Saul and all the Israelites held a great celebration.

### **Turn** over to I Samuel 13

# Samuel 13

<sup>1</sup> Saul was thirty years old when he became king, and he reigned over Israel forty-two years. <sup>2</sup> Saul chose three thousand men from Israel; two thousand were with him at Micmash and in the hill country of Bethel, and a thousand were with Jonathan at Gibeah in Benjamin. The rest of the men he sent back to their homes.

<sup>3</sup> Jonathan attacked the Philistine outpost at Geba, and the Philistines heard about it. Then Saul had the trumpet blown throughout the land and said, "Let the Hebrews hear!" <sup>4</sup> So all Israel heard the news: "Saul has attacked the Philistine outpost, and now Israel has become a stench to the Philistines." And the people were summoned to join Saul at Gilgal.

<sup>5</sup> The Philistines assembled to fight Israel, with three thousand chariots, six thousand charioteers, and soldiers as numerous as the sand on the seashore. They went up and camped at Micmash, east of Beth Aven. <sup>6</sup> When the men of Israel saw that their situation was critical and that their army was hard pressed, they hid in caves and thickets, among the rocks, and in pits and cisterns. <sup>7</sup> Some Hebrews even crossed the Jordan to the land of Gad and Gilead. **Saul remained at Gilgal**, and all the troops with him were quaking with fear. <sup>8</sup> He waited seven days, the time set by Samuel; but Samuel did not come to Gilgal, and Saul's men began to scatter.

# Joshua 5 Circumcision at Gilgal

<sup>1</sup> Now when all the Amorite kings west of the Jordan and all the Canaanite kings along the coast heard how the LORD had dried up the Jordan before the Israelites until we had crossed over, their hearts melted and they no longer had the courage to face the Israelites.

<sup>2</sup> At that time the LORD said to Joshua, "Make flint knives and circumcise the Israelites again." <sup>3</sup> So Joshua made flint knives and circumcised the Israelites at Gibeath Haaraloth.

## Genesis 34:24-26

<sup>24</sup> All the men who went out of the city gate agreed with Hamor and his son Shechem, and every male in the city was circumcised.

<sup>25</sup> Three days later, while all of them were still in pain, two of Jacob's sons, Simeon and Levi, Dinah's brothers, took their swords and attacked the unsuspecting city, killing every male. <sup>26</sup> They put Hamor and his son Shechem to the sword and took Dinah from Shechem's house and left.

## Joshua 5

<sup>8</sup> And after the whole nation had been circumcised, they remained where they were in camp until they were healed.

<sup>9</sup> Then the LORD said to Joshua, "Today I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you." So the place has been called Gilgal to this day. **BACK to I Samuel 13** 

# I Samuel 13

<sup>9</sup> So he said, "Bring me the burnt offering and the fellowship offerings." And Saul offered up the burnt offering. <sup>10</sup> Just as he finished making the offering, Samuel arrived, and Saul went out to greet him.

<sup>11</sup> "What have you done?" asked Samuel.

Saul replied, "When I saw that the men were scattering, and that **you did not come at the set time**, and that the Philistines were assembling at Micmash, <sup>12</sup> I thought, 'Now the Philistines will come down against me at Gilgal, and I have not sought the LORD's favor.' So I felt compelled to offer the burnt offering."

<sup>13</sup> "You acted foolishly," Samuel said. "You have **not kept the command** the LORD your God gave you; if you had, he would have established your kingdom over Israel for all time. <sup>14</sup> But now your kingdom will not endure; the LORD has **Sought out a man after his own heart** and appointed him leader of his people, because you have not kept the LORD's command."
