



Judges 14

- v. 3 - (NAS) "Get her for me, for she looks good to me." (Exodus 34:16 Deuteronomy 7:3)
- v. 6 - The **Spirit of the LORD** came upon him in power so that he tore the lion apart with his bare hands.
- v. 9 - He gave them some, and they too ate it.
But he did **not tell them** _____ **Rules!** that he had taken the honey from the lion's carcass.
- v. 12 - "Let me **tell you a riddle**," Samson said to them. When we are **not chasing God's LOVE**, we are **chasing** _____!!!
- v. 15 - On the fourth day, they said to Samson's wife, "Coax your husband into explaining the riddle for us, or we will **burn you** and your father's household to **death**." The **world** is a _____ place to live!!!
- v. 16 - Then Samson's wife threw herself on him, sobbing, "**You hate me! You don't really love me.**" God wants us to ask...
- v. 19 - Then the **Spirit of the LORD** came upon him in power. He went down to Ashkelon, struck down thirty of their men, stripped them of their belongings and gave their clothes to those who had explained the riddle. **Burning with anger, he went up to his father's house.**
- v. 20 - And Samson's wife was given to the friend who had attended him at his wedding.

Mean people hurting mean people **EVERYONE** Offended!

*How many would say – "I have **wronged Others** MUCH **MORE** than others have wronged me!"*

Judges 15

- v. 4-5 - 300 foxes.
- v. 6 - Burned her and her father to death
- v. 8 - He attacked them viciously
- v. 13 - Bound him with two new ropes
The Spirit of the LORD came upon him in power. The ropes on his arms became like charred flax, and the bindings dropped from his hands.
- 15 Finding a fresh jawbone of a donkey, he grabbed it and struck down a thousand men. 16 Then Samson said, "With a donkey's jawbone I have made donkeys of them. With a donkey's jawbone I have killed a thousand men."
- 17 When he finished speaking, he threw away the jawbone; and the place was called Ramath Lehi.
- 18 Because he was very thirsty, he **cried out to the LORD**, "You have **given your servant** this great victory. Must I now die of thirst and fall into the hands of the uncircumcised?"
- 19 Then **God opened up** the hollow place in Lehi, and **water came out** of it. When Samson drank, his strength returned and he revived. So the spring was called En Hakkore, and it is still there in Lehi.
- v. 20 - **Samson** led Israel for **twenty years** in the days of the Philistines.
