¹⁵ The people were <u>waiting expectantly</u> and were **all wondering** in their hearts if John **might possibly be the** <u>Messiah</u>.

¹⁶ John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one who is more **<u>powerful than I</u>** will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not **<u>worthy to untie</u>**.

Every service a slave does for his master, a disciple should do for his teacher except that of loosening his sandals.

He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

¹⁷ His winnowing **fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn**, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire."

¹⁸ And with many <u>other</u> words John <u>exhorted</u> the people and <u>proclaimed</u> the **good news** to them.

¹⁹ But when **John rebuked Herod the tetrarch** because of his marriage to Herodias, his brother's wife, and all the other evil things he had done, ²⁰ Herod added this to them all: He locked John up in prison. ²¹ When all the people were being baptized, **Jesus was baptized too**.

<u>And as he was praying</u>, heaven was opened ²² and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: <u>"You are my Son, whom I</u> love; with you I am well pleased."

²³Now Jesus himself was **about thirty years old** when he began his ministry.

- 1. (Easy Question) True or False A Test by Satan shows that we are OUT of God's Will!
- The Greek word for Jesus being tempted or tested by Satan is the Greek word "*peirazō*" which comes from the root "*peira*" which means to "*Pierce Through*" or "*Expose*".

A "**Test**" is something that "**exposes**" what is "**inside**" us.

- 3. Why is it a significant part of the first test that:
 - Jesus' fast was over (v.2) &
 - The word "IF" in vs. 3 can also be translated "SINCE"?
- 4. By what method did Jesus travel to this high Mountain?
 - Luke 4:5 the devil "led him up" (anagō to lead with permission)
 - Matthew 4:5 the devil "took him" (paralambanō to hold or carry next to)
- 5. Luke says that they went to a high mountain, but Matthew points out that it was an **EXCEEDINGLY** High Mountain. Here are the options for nearby mountains.
 - Mt. Hermon 130 miles straight north from the wilderness where Jesus met the devil. About 7,000 ft. above sea level. This
 is still NOT a tall mountain. In the United States there are 92 mountains basically TWICE as tall as Mt. Hermon –
 over 14,000 ft
 - Mt. Kilimanjaro in Africa 19,000 ft. was 2,400 miles away -
 - The Himalayas have all 14 of the mountains over 20,000 feet which is considered an "Exceedingly" high mountain including Mt. Everest **29,000** feet above sea level. 3,000 miles away
