It helps so much to not hear only one person's limited opinion.

What are the **Four Major**
interpretations of **Pre-destination?**

There are **four major *interpretations*** of what the word “*Predestination*” means and how it applies to our daily life as a Christian.

In this brief study, I will list all four interpretations. They are:

1. **End Times** vs. **Individual Free Will**
2. **God’s promise** to **reach** those who **WANT** to **understand**
3. It is a **Mystery!**
4. **Man** actually does **NOT** have a **Free Will!**

End Times vs. Individual Free Will

This is the **strongest, clearest** and **simplest** interpretation of God's Word on the subject of "Predestination"

There are three major reasons why this could be accurate.

1. The Clear Message of Scripture

There are 31,173 total verses in the Bible.

There are:

- **29** verses in the Bible on "**Predestination**" and
- **31,154** verses in the Bible on "**Free Will**"

Predestination is a **side** subject in the Bible.

It is **NOT** a **major** subject but is simply a **rabbit trail** that the Apostle Paul traveled to **explain** how **God's Purpose** in the **End Times** will be fulfilled.

Scripture has **many examples** of how God is able to fulfill his promises and yet **NOT violate** man's **individual free will**.

Perhaps Mordecai said it best when he told Esther:

*Esther 4:14 For IF you remain silent at this time, **relief** and **deliverance** for the Jews **WILL ARISE** from **ANOTHER** place, but **you** and your father's family **will PERISH**. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?"*

This verse in Esther really **closes** the **subject** on the possibility that you have **no choice** in your **eternal destiny**. Please read it again carefully.

Mordecai makes it **VERY CLEAR** to Esther that **GOD'S PURPOSES** are **totally** and **definitely** going to be **FULFILLED**.

In **addition**, he makes it clear to Esther that **she** has a **CHOICE**.

- If she **chooses** to **cooperate**, she will be **blessed**.
- If she **resists God**, **she** will **pay** the **price**, but **God's will** in the **overall purpose** and plan God has can **NOT** be **stopped**.

Here is **another example** of Jesus explaining that Predestination has more to do with God's end times plan than about individual free will.

*Mt.18:7 Woe to the world because of the things that cause people to sin. Such things **MUST COME**
But **WOE** to the man **THROUGH WHOM** they come.*

Notice how clearly Jesus states that:

- God's **ETERNAL** plan **will** be **fulfilled** and it is **IMPOSSIBLE** for it to **not** take place ...
- **BUT** each person is **RESPONSIBLE** for **how** they **CHOOSE** to participate in or to resist God's plan.

2. The Logic of the Concept

Predestination is a **simple** subject.

Each individual man has free will, but predestination means that God's overall purpose for humanity will prevail.

Romans 9 deserves a separate chapter.

The main subject of Romans 9

Of the **29** verses on predestination in the Bible, **25** of them are in **Romans 9**.

The **MAIN SUBJECT** of Romans 9 is that God has **PRE-DESTINED** that there **will** be a **time** during the **End Times** when there will be a **Great In-Gathering** of the **Jewish people**.

Every other comment in Romans 9 is simply **expansions** and **explanations** about **how** God can **promise** that there will be a Great In-Gathering of the Jewish people at the End Times.

What about Pharoah?

Now let's read **what** the **Bible** says about Pharoah. It is **significant** that **Paul chose Pharoah**.

Exodus makes this very clear.

TEN TIMES Exodus tells us that
Pharoah **HARDENED** his **OWN** heart.

Ex. 5:2, 5:4-9, 5:17-18, 7:13, 7:22, 7:23, 8:15, 8:19, 8:32, 9:7

BEFORE

it mentions **six times**
that **God hardened** Pharaoh's heart
Exodus 9:12, 10:1, 10:20, 10:27, 11:10, and 14:8

It seems very **obvious** that
Pharoah CHOSE to harden his own heart,
and that God **accelerated** the process
after Pharoah had **already made** his **strong choice**.

Chap. 4

What is the
**“God’s promise to reach those who
 WANT to understand”**
interpretation?

There is **only one verse** in the Bible that **EXPLAINS** the subject of **“Predestination”**.

It is:

Romans 8:29
 For those **God FOREKNEW**
 he **ALSO PREDESTINED**
*to be conformed to the likeness of his Son, that he
 might be the firstborn among many brothers*

It is **significant** that
Paul intentionally wrote this verse
ONE chapter BEFORE
 he **wrote Romans 9**
 about the End Times gathering of the Jews.

“Predestination” **could** be an **explanation** of one of the **questions** that **rings** in the **heart** of **every** passionate Christian. Here is a rough paraphrase of that question.

*“Father, I will live my life to bring you glory and to bring others to
 you, yet my **heart grieves** for those who have
NEVER HAD A CHANCE to hear the Gospel!
What about them Father?”*

Romans 8:29 could be seen as a **promise** from our **Father** that he knows every heart **BEFORE** they are born. Ps. 139

In His Goodness and Love, He is promising us that He will make sure that **everyone** who **WANTS** to come to **Christ** will be **given** the **opportunity**.

What are the last two interpretations?

Interpretation # 3 –

It is a Mystery

Paul alludes to this when he concludes this subject in Rom. 11:33-34 by saying that this subject is beyond human comprehension.

Interpretation # 4 –

Man actually does NOT have a Free Will.

The deeper you look into this fourth doctrine the weirder & more evil it becomes.

- It requires a **decision** to **ignore tens of thousands** of verses about human choice. Words like “*Chose, Choice, Because, If, Should, Be, Do, Do Not, Therefore, Consequently*” etc. must be “**Explained Away**” in studying the Bible.
- It requires a decision to ignore the fact that the **entire gospel** is **based on choice**
- It requires a decision to ignore the fact that God is **Love** and the basis of **Love** is **Free choice**.
- It requires a decision to ignore the **weird secondary doctrines** that **arise** out of this doctrine. There are a **LOT** of them!
- It requires a decision to **ignore** the lack of **fruit** in the **lives** of those who **passionately teach** this **doctrine**.
- It requires a **decision** to ignore the **weak Bible Study** of those who **passionately teach** this **doctrine**.

Personally, I am **very comfortable** with **all three** of the **first three** interpretations of God’s Word on the subject of “Predestination”.

However, that fourth interpretation - that man does not have a free will - I do **not** see this as an **accurate study** of **God’s word**.

Below are two of the thousands of scriptures that clearly state that each man has a choice in his eternal destiny.

II Peter 3:3-9 First of all, you must understand that in the last days scoffers will come, scoffing and following their own evil desires. They will say, "Where is this 'coming' he promised? Ever since our fathers died, everything goes on as it has since the beginning of creation." But they deliberately forget that long ago by God's word the heavens existed and the earth was formed out of water and by water. By these waters also the world of that time was deluged and destroyed. By the same word the present heavens and earth are reserved for fire, being kept for the day of judgment and destruction of ungodly men.

*But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. 9The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is **patient** with you,*

***not wanting** anyone to perish,
but **everyone** to come to **repentance**.*

*1 Tim. 2:3-4 This is good, and pleases God our Savior,
who **wants all men** to be **saved**
and to come to a knowledge of the truth.*

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
