15 - **Most angels remained faithful to God** Revelation 5:11-12

16 - **Angels were created to glorify and worship God the Father and God the Son** Revelation 4:8, Hebrews 1:6

17 - **Angels report to God** Job 1:6, Job 2:1

19 - **Angels announced the birth of Jesus** Luke 2:10-14

20 - **Angels perform the will of God** Psalm 104:4

21 - **Angels ministered to Jesus** Matthew 4:11, Luke 22:43

22 - **Angels help and minister to humans** Heb. 1:14,

23 - **Angels rejoice in God's work of creation** Job 38:1-7, Rev. 4:11

24 - **Angels rejoice in God's work of salvation** Luke 15:10

25 - **Angels will join all believers in the heavenly kingdom** Heb. 12:22-23

26 - **Angels are messengers** Daniel 4:13

27 - **Some angels are called cherubim** Ezekiel 10:20

28 - **Some angels are called seraphim** Isaiah 6:1-8 These are tall angels, each with six wings, and they can fly.

29 - **Three angels have names in the Bible** Gabriel, Michael, & Lucifer or Satan Dan. 8:16, Luke 1:19, 26

30 - **Only one angel in the Bible is called an Archangel!** Michael is the only angel to be called an archangel in the Bible. He is described as "one of the chief princes," so it is possible that there are other archangels.. The word "archangel" "archangelos" means "a chief angel." It refers to an angel ranked highest or in charge of other angels. Daniel 10:13, 12:1, Jude 9, Revelation 12:7
