DIVING DEEPER DISCUSSION GUIDE



INTRODUCTION (OBSERVATION):

- 1. After his exhortation not to be weary in doing good (v. 13), Paul turns to address the question of how to deal with believers who refuse to obey. (v. 14)
 - What two verbs does Paul use in his instructions of how to treat the disobedient brother?
 - What purpose does Paul have in mind in this confrontation?
 - Paul concludes this instruction with a negative exhortation and a positive one. What are they?
- 2. What two qualifiers does Paul add to his benediction about how he God will give His people peace?

DISCUSSION (INTERPRETATION):

Letters such as this were usually dictated to a scribe. In view of the reason this letter had to be composed (see 2:1-2), why did Paul feel he needed to make his remark about writing his greeting with his own hand?

SO WHAT? (APPLICATION):

- 1. How is loving confrontation a ministry in the body?
- 2. Confrontation is a much-neglected ministry in our churches today. Why is this so? (There are many possible contributing factors, so give this some thought.)
- 3. If you were to create a protocol for loving confrontation based on this text, what key points would you want to include?
- 4. What additional insight does Gal 6:6:1-2 bring to the question of how we ought to conduct ourselves when we minister to one another in confrontation?
