Chapter 4: Settled Mind

1. Reasonableness

- Greek = Gentle, yielded(submitted?), moderate, unwillingness to contend - ex. Jn 8 Woman Caught in adultery
- Paul was calling for these two women to get things figured out & agree in the Lord - not bicker about petty things
- They shared previously in the partnership of the Gospel with Paul, Clement & others
- Asked Leadership to step in & help

Chapter 4: Settled Mind

2. Confident in the Lord's Return ("At Hand")

- No time for the unimportant & temporal, to reconcile things quickly
- Last Generation Mentality - live with anticipation, excitement and... eyes & ears open, looking for the signs!
- Urgency to share to get the gospel out, to do missions = No greater Joy
- Calls us to Righteousness, holiness, readiness - 1 John 3:1-10

"[15] And if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire."

3. Guarded by Peace through Prayer

- It's the first & the last thing that is done = with Thanksgiving
- NOT- a "I guess all we can do is pray" mentality after we have stressed out & exhausted all other solutions
- Note: Request...not demands
- Doesn't just guard you mind but your heart - peace is a fruit of the presence of the Holy Spirit...this then leads to Joy another fruit

National surveys in 2025 rank lack of commitment, infidelity, conflict, and financial issues as the leading causes of divorce. According to the National Fatherhood Initiative's 'National Survey of Marital Strengths,' incompatibility remains a top cause alongside financial issues, while financial disagreements are cited by over a third of all divorcing couples.

CDFA professionals consistently report that disparate objectives, values around money, and the stress of financial decision-making during divorce remain universal across all backgrounds. The need for professional guidance in navigating these issues is stronger than ever, with recent surveys highlighting dramatic rises in client reliance on CDFA expertise during divorce.

- v. 13 is misquoted and taken out of context all the time!...what does this mean in the context of Christ & the Gospel?

6. Discovers the JOY of Giving = Kingdom Investments

- They're Seeking Kingdom fruit/credits
- Giving to something outside of ourselves, that gives me no personal benefit, but God uses for benefit in the life of someone else

- The Philippian's investment in Paul's ministry was investment in all those he lead to Christ and raised up in ministry!
- "Tithe" - just means Tenth(10%) - about obedience to the Lord not the amount
