Sermon Discussion Questions - December 26 & 28, 2025 Good Plans

<u>Ice Breaker:</u> Christmas can bring up all kinds of emotions and experiences for us.

 Q1: As Christmas comes to a close, what's one word that describes how you're feeling right now? (Peaceful, relieved, tired, hopeful, etc.)

As the holidays wrap up, we can look back and see the ways God provided this year.

- Q2: Looking back over this past year, where did you see God at work in your life? (Provision, healing, breakthrough, restored relationships, etc.)
- Q3: What was something about this year that was hard or disappointing for you? How have you—or how could you—bring that to God?

As we wrap up this year, we also start looking ahead to what God might do in 2026!

Q4: How do New Year's resolutions usually make you feel—motivated,
 pressured, indifferent, guilty, excited? Why do you think that is?

Q5: What are some of your hopes for the new year? What are your fears?
In the middle of all that cultural and personal pressure, God invites us to root our identity in Christ.
 Q6: What truths about your identity in Christ are hardest to remember when a new year begins?
 Q7: Instead of resolutions, what might it look like to enter the New Year from a place of trust rather than striving?
God is always inviting us to know Him more deeply through the work of His Spirit in us.
 Q8: Looking back on 2025, where did you experience spiritual growth? How did you see God at work in you?
Q9: As you look toward 2026, what's one area where you're hoping to grow? What's a simple first step you could take this week towards that goal?
