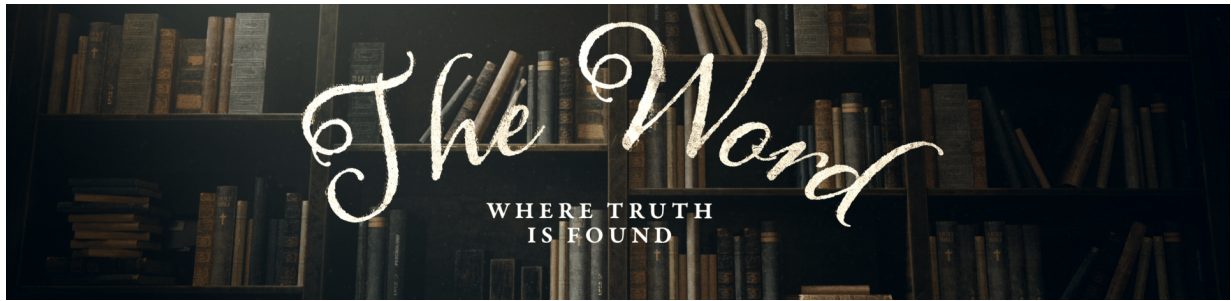




Sermon Discussion Questions - September 18 & 20, 2026

The Word: Week 2

The Word is: Trustworthy

Ice Breaker: *The Bible's reliability is often questioned in our culture. As Satan seeks to undermine our confidence in God's Word, it's important for us to know why we can trust Scripture.*

- **Q1: Where do you see people questioning or challenging the Bible's reliability in our culture today?**

As God's Word, the Bible is entirely true, trustworthy, and without error.

- **Q2: Have you ever wrestled with doubts or questions about the Bible's reliability? What questions have you had?**
- **Q3: What do you do when you come across something in the Bible that you don't understand or have a hard time reconciling?**

The Bible encourages us to love God with our minds and to be ready to give a reason for the hope that we have!

- **Q4: What is something new you learned from this week's sermon? How did it strengthen your confidence in the trustworthiness of the Bible?**

We can trust the Bible because of the historical evidence for it and because we have seen its power to transform lives.

- **Q5: How have you seen God's Word change someone's life—either your own or someone else's?**

As followers of Jesus, the Bible should impact and shape every area of our lives.

- **Q6: If we truly believe that God's Word is trustworthy and sufficient, how should that affect the way we live, make decisions, and respond to difficult circumstances?**

We can approach Scripture with confidence, knowing that God has given us what we need to continue growing in our faith.

- **Q7: What questions do you still have about the Bible's reliability? What could you do this week to explore those questions with courage and investigate the evidence for yourself?**

If the Bible really is the true and trustworthy Word of God, we can have confidence in it—even when that confidence is challenged by other voices.

- **Q8: Is there an area of your life where you need to trust and submit to God's Word more fully, rather than listening to competing voices?**

Take a few minutes to encourage each other, and spend some time in prayer together!
