John 15:1-11

Questions:

- Read John 15:1-11. Wasn't it a blessing to celebrate the graduates this Sunday? As we
 reflect on their journey, it's a reminder that we face new experiences that challenge our
 beliefs. We may think we've overcome these challenges, but in reality, we encounter daily
 tests to our faith that urge us to rely on something other than God.
 - What aspect of your life, be it a belief, value, goal, or desire, often tempts you to prioritize it over abiding in Him? How does this choice impact your decisions and your relationship with God?
- Think of a person who owns their relationship with God. What is their relationship with God like? What do they say or do that makes you think they are secure in their faith? What is their demeanor like towards those around them?

- When we choose to abide in God, we bring Him glory! But what does it truly mean to abide in Him? What should our daily, moment-to-moment actions look like if we are to find our rest in Him? And in what ways does God receive glory when we choose to dwell in His presence?
- In John 15, Jesus paints a beautiful picture of the Church. He compares Himself to the main stem of a vine, and he calls us the branches. He states that we will be trimmed away or pruned to make us more productive. How has this idea played out in your life? How has he pruned the unfruitful branches in your life? How did it allow you to be more fruitful?
- We have all, at times, placed our faith in something other than God. We look to our career, money, relationships, or something else for joy and security. What is that thing for you?
 What results from placing your hope in a worldly savior rather than the heavenly savior?
 Does it ever truly satisfy your need for security? How do you treat those around you while serving your worldly savior?
- Jesus gives us what we are all searching for when we are connected in a deeply intimate relationship with him. He gives us love, joy, peace, and hope, which produces the fruits of the Spirit in us. How has placing your faith in Jesus led you to love others well?
