<u>Ice Breaker:</u> Matthew's account of Jesus's birth leaves out a lot of details—like how Mary and Joseph's families responded.

 Q1: What's the most unexpected or awkward thing that's ever happened at a family gathering? How did everyone react?

Read Matthew 1:18-25 together. In the middle of disrupted plans, God brought the Messiah through Mary and Joseph's obedience.

 Q2: Have you ever had your plans completely fall apart—but looking back, it turned out to be a turning point in your faith?

Joseph's obedience came with a personal cost—his reputation, comfort, maybe even relationships.

• Q3: Can you think of a time when following God cost you something—socially, financially, emotionally, or otherwise?

In order for Jesus to be a Son of David, Joseph needed to legally adopt Him.

• Q4: How does it impact your faith to know that the Gospel begins with Jesus being adopted—and ends with us being adopted into God's family?

Mary and Joseph exhibited profound faithfulness in the middle of chaos and uncertainty.

- Q5: How does their obedience encourage you in your own season of difficulty or waiting?
- Q6: How does the raw, messy nature of Jesus's birth story affect how you think about where God might want to show up in your own life?

Jesus is the incarnate son of God who came to save us from our sins—not just from hardship, injustice, or pain.

 Q7: Why is it so important to remember that our deepest need is to be saved from sin—not just from external problems in the world?

This story invites us into a life of faithful obedience, knowing that God is with us until the end of the age.

 Q8: What's one small, faithful step of obedience you feel nudged to take this week—even if it's scary or difficult?

Take a few minutes to encourage each other and spend some time in prayer together!
