Philippians 2:1-11

Questions:

- Read Philippians 2:1-11. In verses 1-2, Paul talks about the importance of having unity in Christ.
 - When have you recently experienced "encouragement in Christ" or "comfort from love" from your circle of friends?
- Verse 3 gives us the challenging command to "count others more significant than yourselves."
 - Discuss the areas of your life where it is easy to rise to this challenge versus where it is the most difficult.

- Verse 4 tells us to diligently attend to the interests of others.
 - Think about a time when someone put your needs before their own. How did it impact your faith?
- This week's passage is all about emulating Christ's humility and willingness to serve.
 - Have you had any opportunities lately to serve others outside of your regular routine? Tell your group what you learned from that experience!
- Christ's sacrifice and exaltation in these verses should affect our understanding of godly community.
 - How does your identity in Christ impact your day-to-day decision making within your community of believers?
- Sometimes in our desire to be humble, we operate out of a toxic low-self esteem.
 - Discuss the differences between humility and low self-esteem. How can this distinction help us to "love others as we love ourselves?"
- Any circle of friends will inevitably face temptations to act selfishly or forsake unity.
 - How can the principles in this week's passage change the way your group handles conflict or disagreements?
- Take a moment to consider the following challenge: "We are a people who remind each other who we really are whenever we forget."
 - Have you ever seen this challenge lived out? Share!
 - Where do you need to grow spiritually in order to rise to this challenge?
