<u>Ice Breaker:</u> As Christians, we often face the challenge of how to respond when we see or experience injustice.

• Q1: Can you think of a time when you felt completely misunderstood or unfairly blamed? How did you handle it?

Read Psalm 69 together. David pours out his heart to God, to the point of being completely worn out—physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

- Q2: Have you ever gone through a tough season where you kept praying but felt like nothing was changing? What was that experience like for you?
- Q3: What kept you going during that time? What motivated you to keep asking
 God for help?

David's zeal for God actually brought him trouble. He was misunderstood and even rejected by those close to him.

Q4: Have you ever felt like your love for God created tension with friends,
 family, or others in your life? What happened?

Many parts of Psalm 69 point ahead to Jesus and His suffering on the cross.

 Q5: Jesus also experienced unfair treatment and deep pain. How does that shape the way you respond to your own struggles—or to the pain others go through?

Imprecatory prayers can make us uncomfortable—-are we even allowed to pray like that?

- Q6: How do you personally wrestle with the idea of praying for justice like
 David did? Does it ever feel uncomfortable or confusing?
- Q7: When you're praying that kind of prayer the right way, what's going on in your heart? What should our attitude or posture be before God in those moments?

Psalm 69 weaves together deep sorrow, a cry for justice, and hope in God.

 Q8: Is there an area of your life right now where you're feeling both grief and hope at the same time? How does Psalm 69 help you bring that tension honestly to God?

Take a few minutes to encourage each other and spend some time in prayer together!
