## Sermon Discussion Questions - December 19 & 21, 2025 Advent 2025 Week 4: Isaiah 53:1-12

**Ice Breaker:** At Christmas, we often focus on the joy, traditions, and celebrations. But sometimes we forget the cross and the empty tomb.

 Q1: What assumptions or expectations about Christmas—or about Jesus—might cause someone to miss who Jesus really is?

Read Isaiah 53:1-12 together. Isaiah says the suffering servant was "despised and rejected."

Q2: In what ways do people today still reject Jesus—both openly and in quieter,
 more subtle ways?

Isaiah also describes the servant as "a man of sorrows, acquainted with grief."

Q3: Are there ways you tend to downplay or minimize your suffering or assume
 God doesn't really care about it? How does this passage challenge or comfort
 you?

•	Q4: How might believing that Jesus truly understands your pain change how
	honestly you bring your struggles to God?

Isaiah makes it clear that Jesus came to be our substitutionary atonement, dying in our place.

- Q5: How does understanding Jesus as your substitute help you keep the full
   Gospel in view during the busyness of the Christmas season?
- Q6: How does knowing that Jesus died in your place shape the way you live, worship, or treat others?

Jesus endured the cross for the "joy set before Him," receiving the servant's reward—and that same inheritance is offered to us if we accept Him!

- Q7: Are there ways that you have been rejecting Jesus—either keeping Him at arms length or openly resisting Him? What is holding you back from surrender?
- Q8: In light of Isaiah 53, what might it look like for you to "come and adore"
   King Jesus in a new or renewed way this season?
